- While ESSERF allocations are determined by the proportionality of the Title I funding formula, these funds are not Title I funds. For example, ESSER funds:

- The SAU will cooperate with any State Controller and/or Department of Education Auditor examination of records under the program.
- The SAU will meet the reporting requirements in 20-A MRSA §15689-B, subsections 7 and 7-A.
- The law requires LEAs to make equitable provision to non-public schools using the Title I
