

Greely Pond, located in the northwest corner of Dallas Plantation, does not provide good coldwater habitat, but a few brook trout are present. It is a shallow pond and water temperatures exceed optimum levels in the summer months.

Greely Pond's inlet originates from Loon Lake to the east and its outlet flows west to the South Branch of the Dead River. It is accessible by a trail off from Route 16 and it is open to fishing with no live fish as bait.
