Aziscohos Pond is located south of Aziscohos Mountain. A small inlet enters the north end of the pond and its outlet, Beaver Brook, flows east into nearby Little Beaver Pond. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Cool, well-oxygenated water in Aziscohos Pond provides good habitat for coldwater gamefish. Brook trout growth is good with no competition from other species. The pond, however, lacks spawning habitat for trout, so annual stockings are necessary in order to maintain a fishery.

Aziscohos Pond is accessible via a trail leading west off the Beaver Pond Road. The pond is open to fishing with no live fish as bait in the open water season and closed to icefishing.
