Little Beaver Pond is located east of Aziscohos Mountain. Its main inlet, Beaver Brook, enters the western end of the pond from Aziscohos Pond. The short outlet, also Beaver Brook, flows east into nearby Beaver Pond. The pond's shoreline is lightly developed.

Water quality in Little Beaver Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. A limited amount of spawning and nursery habitat is available in Beaver Brook and is utilized to sustain low numbers of wild brook trout. Annual stockings of brook trout are made to supplement the wild population. Trout growth is fair with heavy competition for food and space.


