Principal Fishery: Brook trout, lake trout

The deep cold waters of Allagash Lake are ideally suited as togue and brook trout habitat. Water below the 30-foot level is cold with abundant oxygen throughout the summer.

Extensive rocky shoals are available as spawning areas for togue. Excellent spawning and nursery areas for brook trout are found in the main inlet. The coldwater fishery is maintained successfully by natural reproduction. No stocking of hatchery fish is necessary at the present time.

Allagash Lake is a unit of the Allagash Wilderness Waterway and as such is subject to regulations concerning the use of canoes, motorized equipment, fires and camping. Anyone contemplating use of this area can contact the Park and Recreation Commission in Augusta.


Allagash Lake is accessible by foot trail or canoe via Allagash Stream.
