

NOTICE TO GENERAL CONTRACTORS
REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS

In conformance with Title 5 M.R.S.A., Section 1747, the Bureau of General Services and Department of Transportation will qualify General Contractors to bid on the Sanford High School and Technical Center project. Interested General Contractors are required to complete a Pre-Bid Qualification Application in order to receive the construction documents and participate in the bidding process. General Contractors that are currently pre-qualified by BGS/DOT specifically for “Buildings” are not required to submit a new application. Contractors currently pre-qualified for buildings are required to send Notice of Intent to Bid by email to valerie.chiang@maine.gov by the deadline noted below. A confirmation receipt will be sent. Any General Contractors not currently pre-qualified by BGS/DOT are directed to complete the State of Maine Prequalification Application for this specific project.

The application must be completed and returned electronically to contractor.prequal@maine.gov, on or before Wednesday, November 18, 2015 at 2:00 p.m. A confirmation of receipt will be sent. Applications received after this deadline will **not** be accepted. This deadline supersedes all other published instructions for application acceptance including Section 2.2.2 of the application and the notice on the DOT Contractor Prequalification web page.

The Project consists of the new construction the Sanford High School and Technical Center, located in Sanford, Maine. Estimated construction cost is \$78,000,000.

Bidding documents prepared by Lavallee Brensinger Architects will be available to pre-qualified general contractor bidders no earlier than January, 2016, with notice to proceed anticipated in April 2016 and Substantial Completion by July 2018.
