Addendum for Gravel Pit Permit

Because we have not had sufficient demand to warrant specific application forms for gravel pits we are using our present Road and Bridge Construction Permit Application form as the base application for such projects. To complete your application for gravel extraction it will also be necessary that you address the additional questions and concerns outlined below.

- Will the extraction be operated in compliance with standards of Section 10.27, C, 2 of the Commission's Land Use Districts and Standards?
- If not, which standards will be exceeded and to what extent?
- With respect to 10.27, C, 2, c: explain in detail what water control devices will be used to prevent erosion/sedimentation.
- How large is the esker/gravel deposit?
- How much gravel will you be extracting?
- For what use?
- Is there an existing pit?
- How large?
- How much larger will your operation make the existing pit?
- How large an area will remain open at any one time?
- What provisions will be made for on-going rehabilitation of the pit?
- What provisions will be made for final reclamation of the pit?
- Provide a schedule for all rehabilitation and reclamation activities.
- Where will topsoil be stored until needed for revegetation?
- Where will topsoil be stabilized for storage?
- How will topsoil be stabilized for storage?
- What is the size of the lift? (height of the operating face)
- What provisions will be made for control of runoff and drainage in the pit?
- In relation to ground water table – to what depth will gravel be extracted?
- Provide detailed descriptions and setbacks of existing and or proposed access routes.
- Will trucking gravel from the site interfere with normal traffic circulation?
- How will access to the area be controlled?
