Park Information



No pets are allowed in the Sebago Lake State Park campground.



When gathering firewood in park, remember, you may use wood that is dead and down, but don't cut down any trees big or small. Chainsaws are not allowed.



In recent years, we have been losing more and more vegetation between sites. If you are in a group occupying more than one site, please try to stay on marked trails and roadways. Use branches from blow downs, not bushes and trees, to cook your hot dogs and marshmallows.



Bicycling has become a very popular activity in the park. Young and old alike need to remember the rules of the road. Stop at intersections, ride on the side and watch for traffic.



If you are a registered camper, you are entitled the use and access of all facilities at Sebago Lake State Park. To check out the day use area, you may do so with your camping permit.

Helpful Reminders

> ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE NOT PERMITTED IN MAINE STATE PARKS

- ➤ Should you require immediate assistance, the parks staff is available to address your problems and concerns. The campground entrance booth is staffed daily from 8:00am to midnight. There is a ranger available at other times in the area if a need should arise, or you will find a "Host" on the following sites (located next to each toilet building) 43, 80, 104, 141, 145, 189 & 191.
- ➤ Lost and found is located at the campground booth, or you may turn items into the Host near your site.
- ➤ Quiet Time in the campground is required between the hours of 10pm and 7am.
- Check in time is 1pm.
- Check out is 11am; however, if you are intending to extend your stay you must return to the entrance booth to pay before 9:30am.
- Campsite visitors will be allowed as follows:
- **1.** After 9am by paying the day use fee and must leave the campground by 8pm.
- **2.** Limit one (1) visiting party per campsite. The total number of people may not exceed eight (8). If you plan to have more guests than this, you should make arrangements to meet in the day use area of the park.
- Total number of vehicles per campsite shall not exceed two (2).
- > Gate is open at 6am and closes at midnight.
- Generators may be used between the hours of 9am and 7pm as long as they do not bother other visitors.


Camper Check Out List
