Along with installing solar panels on the Blaine House, she recently signed an executive order encouraging state agencies to lead by example as we combat climate change. I'm hoping you will join me in striving to be as environmentally conscious as possible both in and out of work. There are many ways we can do this, such as:

- Using a reusable water bottle.
- Consider bringing silverware from home instead of using plastic ware.
- Using a compost pile for unwanted food.
- Consider carpooling to work with a friend or using the <u>GO Maine system</u>. (Did you know that 53% of all Maine greenhouse gas emissions come from transportation?)
- When traveling in and out of state, consider using the Amtrak Downeaster, which
 recently offered a 15% discount to all state employees! Check your inbox for more
 information (and know that a Q&A regarding some common questions about this
 discount is coming soon).
- Consider what you are buying this year for holiday presents. Buying locally, making homemade gifts, or giving charitable presents are great green alternatives.
- If you are in the market for a new vehicle, remember that some state office locations
 are getting electric vehicle charging stations soon! This is in addition to the <u>numerous</u>
 <u>charging stations</u> already located in certain areas of the state. Remember, some electric
 vehicles (along with other green solutions) are also eligible for rebate programs via
 <u>Efficiency ME</u>.
