By letter dated March 15, 2012, attorney Thomas Doyle filed, on behalf of the licensee, a Motion to Dismiss your appeal of the Public Benefit Determination for the proposed expansion of the Juniper Ridge Landfill. In the Motion to Dismiss, Mr. Doyle argues that you do not have standing as an aggrieved person to bring an appeal in this matter.
