Patriot Renewables, LLC (Patriot) and Tetra Tech, Inc. (Tetra Tech) thank you for your review of the archaeological assessment of the limit of disturbance for the Canton Mountain Wind Project access road in the vicinity of the Dunn Cemetery in Dixfield. We understand that the MHPC recommends the road widening project proceed as planned, though with the understanding that there remains a possibility that historic burials may be present on the east side of the road. Patriot has confirmed it understands that if during construction activities, indications of burials are found, the contractor must cease construction in the vicinity immediately and notify town officials and the MHPC.
