### PUBLIC HEARING TOWN OF LINCOLN

The Town of Lincoln Planning Board will hold a Public Hearing on May 16, 2011 at the regular Planning Board I meeting at 7:00 pm to hear oral and written comments on the proposed amendment to the Land Use Ordinance section 1311.4.IV Institutional Activities and Commercial Activities. The proposed change would allow professional offices, office buildings and hospital/medical clinics in the DR1 zone for the area defined as Tax Map 37 Lots 24 and 25 with Planning Board Approval. ### NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETINGS AND INTENT TO FILE

Please take notice that Evergreen Wind Power II, LLC and Maine GenLead, LLC (the "Applicants"), subsidiaries of First Wind, with its principal offices at 179 Lincoln Street, Suite 500, Boston, MA 02111, (617-960-2888) intend to file a Natural Resources Protection Act permit amendment application and a Site Location of Development permit amendment application, pursuant to the provisions of 38 M.R.S.A. §§ 480-A et seq. and 38 M.R.S.A. 38 M.R.S.A. §§ 481-490, respectively, and regulations thereunder. These amendment applications would be filed with the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP). The Applicants will also be seeking a Section 401 Water Quality Certification pursuant to 33 U.S.C. § 1341.

The applications will amend the permit for the Oakfield Wind Project by reducing the number of turbines in the original project area by 9 turbines; adding 15 turbines in Oakfield to the east of the existing project area; adding 10 turbines in T4R3 WELS to the south of the existing project; changing the turbine type; adding an electrical substation on South Oakfield Road; and constructing a 115kV transmission line from Oakfield to the Keene Road substation in Chester. Portions of the transmission line would be located in Oakfield, Linneus, T4R3 WELS, T3R3 WELS, Glenwood, Reed, North Yarmouth Academy Grant, Macwahoc, Molunkus, Mattawamkeag, Woodville and Chester. The total number of turbines for the project would increase from 34 to 50, with the capacity to generate up to 150 megawatts of electricity.

The applicants will hold two public meetings on the project. On May 23rd, at 6 p.m., there will be a public meeting at the Smoki Haulers Club on the Oakfield-Smyrna Road. On May 24th, at 6 p.m. there will be a public meeting at the Mattawamkeag Town Office on Route 2. The purpose of the meetings is to educate the public about the project and the regulatory process, and to seek public comment on the proposed amendments.

The Applicants intend to file the amendment applications with the DEP on or before June 10, 2011. The applications will also be available for inspection at the Oakfield, Linneus, Mattawamkeag, Woodville and Chester Town offices. Requests for a DEP public hearing must be made within 20 days after DEP accepts the application as complete. Contact DEP project manager Jessica Damon (941-4570) to determine when the applications are accepted as complete. Comments on the applications will be accepted at any time during the period the application is processed.



**PUBLIC NOTICE FILING AND CERTIFICATION**

Department Rules, Chapter 2, require an applicant to provide public notice for all Tier 2, Tier 3 and individual Natural Resources Protect Act projects. In the notice, the applicant must describe the proposed activity and where it is located. "Abutter" for the purposes of the notice provision means any person who owns property that is BOTH (1) adjoining and (2) within one mile of the delineated project boundary, including owners of property directly across a public or private right of way.

1. **Newspaper:** You must publish the Notice of Intent to File in a newspaper circulated in the area where the activity is located. The notice must appear in the newspaper within 30 days prior to the filing of the application with the Department. You may use the attached Notice of Intent to File form, or one containing identical information, for newspaper publication and certified mailing.
2. **Abutting Property Owners:** You must send a copy of the Notice of Intent to File by certified mail to the owners of the property abutting the activity. Their names and addresses can be obtained from the town tax maps or local officials. They must receive notice within 30 days prior to the filing of the application with the Department.
3. **Municipal Office:** You must send a copy of the Notice of Intent to File and a **duplicate of the entire application** to the Municipal Office.

**ATTACH a list of the names and addresses of the owners of abutting property.**

**CERTIFICATION**


By signing below, the applicant or authorized agent certifies that:

1. A Notice of Intent to File was published in a newspaper circulated in the area where the project site is located within 30 days prior to filing the application;
2. A certified mailing of the Notice of Intent to File was sent to all abutters within 30 days of the filing of the application;
3. A certified mailing of the Notice of Intent to File, and a duplicate copy of the application was sent to the town office of the municipality in which the project is located; and
4. Provided notice of and held a public informational meeting, if required, in accordance with Chapter 2, Rules Concerning the Processing of Applications, Section 13, prior to filing the application. Notice of the meeting was sent by certified mail to abutters and to the town office of the municipality in which the project is located at least ten days prior to the meeting. Notice of the meeting was also published once in a newspaper circulated in the area where the project site is located at least seven days prior to the meeting.
