Comments	Greater numbers of feeding shorebirds were observed on Royal River in comparison to the Cousins River. Birds observed feeding on all flats located on the Royal River including first/last mud area by the boat landing. The most productive last mud area is located east of the saltmarsh roosting area on the north shore of the Royal River. 2010-2012 Casco Bay shorebird surveys recorded good numbers of roosting least sandpipers and lesser yellowlegs in the Cousins River saltmarsh. Also recorded Nelsons sharp-tailed sparrow. This area may be more likely to support oiled shorebirds than offshore sites given its close proximity to Royal River feeding area., primary feeding area; numbers higher on low rising tide, last mud high use area





May provide a mist net or netgun opportunity if birds are roosting in the cobble. Birds also congregate at first or last mud on the small marshy area next to the Yarmouth Boat Landing Town Park. This area may also present a capture opportunity although high disturbance from boaters and park goers.
