




A-29-2 Mast Cove



Strategy Implementation

This is a one piece exclusionary configuration 2,000 feet long.

1. Establish communications with Command Center
2. Use river current to assist deployment.
3. Deploy from PRC boom reel parked at Eliot boat ramp.
Attach down river end to a location between one of two locations at the point upriver of the Eliot boat ramp.
1) 43 06.880N and 70 47.949 W or
2) 43 06.793 N and 70 47.964 W.
Attach upriver end to shore at 43 07.121N and 70 48.117 W near a residence with small boats on the shore.
4. Observe deployment for stability.
