How to clean up mercury

Follow these steps to clean up mercury from a broken auto switch:

- Do not use a vacuum cleaner. This will spread mercury into the air and contaminate the vacuum.
- Keep people and pets away until you finish cleanup.
- Wear gloves you can throw away.
- As you clean up, put all waste into a glass container with metal lid, or into a heavy duty plastic container with a tight lid.
- Use stiff paper to scoop up bigger balls of mercury. Put mercury and paper in waste container.
- Pat spill area with sticky side of duct tape or masking tape to pick up small pieces of mercury. Put dirty tape in waste container.
- Wipe the area with a wet wipe or damp paper towel. Put dirty wipe/paper towel in waste container.
- Put dirty gloves into waste container.
- Use a flashlight to check for missed mercury, and clean up with tape as needed.
- Wash your hands.
- Label the container "mercury waste".
- Call, or take the container to, a hazardous waste company.
- If you need to store the waste container, put it in a place away from people where it will not get broken by mistake.
- Open windows and doors to air out the space for at least 15 minutes and up to several hours.
