Since the standalone CAPs and FSPs do not have infrastructure (construction) projects associated with them, it is difficult to prioritize the applications for funding using the Department's Environmental Priority Point System. A. Climate Adaptation Plan (CAP): The Department is offering up to \$25,000 in loan PF to borrowers that want to develop a CAP and <u>have not previously received funding from the</u> <u>Department for a CAP</u>.
