Dear Mr. Ciembroniewicz:

This correspondence responds to yours dated November 13, 2015 in which your client, Redington-Fairview General Hospital proposes to make renovations to its hospital in Skowhegan, Maine. The capital cost for this project is estimated to be \$7.5 million.

Based on the information you provided, the Department of Health and Human Services has determined that the proposal as written is not subject to review. The applicable reason(s) this is a covered project are indicated below (see 22 M.R.S.A. 329 (1-6):

- checkbox This project is not a transfer of ownership or acquisition of control of a health care facility.
checkbox This project is not an acquisition of major medical equipment where the expenditure exceeds \$3,458,163.
checkbox This project is not a new health service where either:
checkbox Capital expenditures exceed \$3,242,028 nor,
checkbox Third year annual expenditures exceed \$1,080,676.
checkbox This project is a not new health care facility where:
checkbox Capital expenditures exceed \$5,000,000 for a nursing facility or
checkbox Capital expenditures exceed \$3,000,000 for other covered facilities.
