



**I. Introduction/ Objectives**

- A. Section C is an assessment of a resident's cognitive patterns.
- B. In MDS 3.0, this assessment is completed by either a resident interview or a staff assessment (not both).
- C. This lesson covers the interview option of the Section C assessment only. The staff assessment and assessment for delirium is covered in another lesson.

**Intent of Section C**

- Determine resident's:
  - o Attention
  - o Orientation
  - o Ability to register and recall new information

**E. Intent of Section C**

1. The items in Section C are intended to determine the resident's:
  - a. Attention
  - b. Orientation
  - c. Ability to register and recall new information

**Importance**

- Crucial factors in care planning decisions made by the interdisciplinary team and resident.
- Misdiagnosis may result in appropriate communication, activities, and therapies not being offered.

**F. Importance**

1. These abilities are crucial factors in care planning decisions made by the interdisciplinary team and resident.
2. When cognitive impairment is incorrectly diagnosed or missed, appropriate communication, worthwhile activities and therapies may not be offered.

**Difficulty Assessing Status**

- Cognitively intact residents may appear to be cognitively impaired because of:
  - o Extreme frailty
  - o Hearing impairment
  - o Lack of interaction
- Residents may appear to be more cognitively intact than they actually are.

**G. Difficulty Assessing Status**

1. Cognitively intact residents may appear to be cognitively impaired because of:
  - a. Extreme frailty
  - b. Hearing impairment
  - c. Lack of interaction
2. Some residents may appear to be more cognitively intact than they actually are.

**Performance-Based Assessment**

- Decreases chance of incorrect labeling of cognitive ability.
- Improves detection of delirium.
- Performance on cognitive tests should be compared over time.
- Consider an assessment for delirium or depression if performance worsens.

**H. Performance-Based Assessment**

1. MDS 3.0 introduces a performance-based method for assessing a resident’s cognitive patterns.
2. Benefits of a performance-based approach.
  - a. Direct or performance-based testing of cognitive function decreases the chance of incorrect labeling of cognitive ability.
  - b. Improves detection of delirium.
  - c. A resident’s performance on cognitive tests should be compared over time.
  - d. Repeating the assessment over time allows you to track a resident’s performance over a period of time.
3. If performance on cognitive tests worsens, then consider an assessment for delirium and/ or depression.

**MDS Assessment Based on Brief Interview for Mental Status**

- Consists of a structured resident interview.
- Opportunity to observe for signs and symptoms of delirium.
- Can be completed or attempted for most residents.
- Complete the staff assessment as an alternative.
- Do not conduct both an interview and a staff assessment.



**I. MDS Assessment Based on Brief Interview for Mental Status (BIMS)**

1. The BIMS consists of a structured resident interview.
2. In addition to assessing cognitive status, the BIMS interview also provides an opportunity to observe residents for signs and symptoms of delirium.
3. The interview should be attempted and completed for most residents.


4. A Section C staff assessment is available but should be used **only** when the BIMS cannot be completed.
5. Perform the staff assessment only for residents who cannot complete the interview.
6. The assessment for Section C does not consist of both an interview and a staff assessment.
7. Do not complete both an interview and staff assessment.

J. Accuracy and Reliability

1. A structured cognitive test such as BIMS is more accurate and reliable than observation alone.
2. Without an attempted structured interview, a resident might be mislabeled based on appearance or assumed diagnosis.
3. Structured interviews will efficiently provide insight into the resident's current condition that will enhance care.
4. Added benefits:
  - a. Assists in identifying needed supports.
  - b. Helpful in identifying possible delirium behaviors (C1300).




**II. Item C0100 Should Brief Interview for Mental Status be Conducted?**

- A. Section C begins with a determination of whether to conduct the BIMS.

- B. Attempt Resident Interview
  1. Determine whether to attempt a resident interview.
  2. Most residents are able to complete the BIMS interview.
  3. Interview may be completed verbally or in writing.


- C. C0100 Conduct the Assessment
  1. Attempt to perform this interview if the resident can be understood at least some of the time.
  2. Check A1100 Language.
  3. Every effort should be made to have an interpreter present for the BIMS interview.
    - a. Schedule an interpreter for the time of the interview if at all possible.

4. Conduct the interview if the resident can respond:
  - a. Verbally

OR

  - b. By writing out his or her answers





- D. C0100 Coding Instructions
  1. Code whether the cognitive interview should be attempted with the resident.
    - **Code 0. No**  
If the interview should not be attempted because the resident is rarely/ never understood or an interpreter is needed but not available  
  
Skip to C0700, Staff Assessment of Mental Status.

*Emphasize skip pattern here.*


- **Code 1. Yes**  
If the interview should be attempted because the resident is at least sometimes understood verbally or in writing and if an interpreter is needed, one is available  
  
Proceed to C0200 Repetition of Three Words.

**III. Brief Interview for Mental Status (BIMS)**

**A. Structure of BIMS**

**1. The BIMS consists of three components:**

**a. C0200 Repetition of Three Words**

- Residents are given three words and asked to repeat these words back to the interviewer immediately.

**b. C0300 Temporal Orientation**

- Residents are asked to state the year, month, and day of the week.

**c. C0400 Recall**

- Residents are asked to repeat the three words provided in the first part of the interview.

**2. Results of the BIMS are compiled into a Summary Score.**

**Conducting the Interview**

- Establish a comfortable environment.
- Be sure the resident can hear you.
- Introduce the interview.
- Address any resident concerns.
- Conduct the interview.
  - Complete the interview in one sitting.
  - Ask each item in the order it appears on the MDS item set.
  - Accept any refusal and move on.

**INSTRUCTIONAL GUIDANCE**

**B. Conducting the Interview**

*Review briefly.*

1. Establish a comfortable environment for conducting the interview.
  - a. Private setting
  - b. Positioning (make sure the resident can see your face)
  - c. Minimize glare from light sources
2. Be sure the resident can hear you.
  - a. Residents with hearing impairment should be interviewed using their usual communication devices/techniques, as applicable.
  - b. Try an external assistive device (headphones or hearing amplifier) if you have any doubt about hearing ability.
  - c. Minimize background noise.
3. Give an introduction before starting the interview.
  - a. Briefly explain to the resident why you are asking these questions.
4. Address any resident concerns.
5. Conduct the interview.
  - a. Complete the interview in one sitting.

- b. Ask the resident each item in C0200 through C0400 directly in the order each item appears on the MDS 3.0 item set.
- c. If the resident refuses to answer any particular item, accept his or her refusal and move on to the next question.

**Suggested language for explaining the BIMS interview**

“I would like to ask you some questions. We ask everyone these same questions. This will help us provide you with better care. Some of the questions may seem very easy, while others may be more difficult.”

**Suggested language for addressing resident concerns**

If the resident expresses concern that you are testing his or her memory, he or she may be more comfortable if you reply: *“We ask these questions of everyone so we can make sure that our care will meet your needs.”*

**Stopping the Interview**

- Stop the interview if necessary.
- Stop after C0300 Temporal Orientation if:
  - All responses have been nonsensical.
  - There has been no verbal or written response to any items up to that point.
  - There has been no verbal or written response to some items and nonsensical responses to the other questions.



- C. Stopping the interview
  1. Stop the interview if necessary.
  2. Stop after C0300 Temporal Orientation if:
    - a. All responses have been nonsensical.
    - b. There has been no verbal or written response to any items up to that point.
    - c. There has been no verbal or written response to some items and nonsensical responses to the other questions.




**D. Assessment for Cognitive Patterns**

1. An assessment must be completed even if an interview cannot be conducted.
2. If the interview cannot be completed, conduct the Staff Assessment for Mental Status (C0700-C1100).

**VI. C0200 Repetition of Three Words**



Slide 19

**A. C0200 Repetition of Three Words.**

1. The resident is asked to repeat three words back to the interviewer.
2. The three words are sock, blue, and bed.
3. An inability to repeat three words on the first attempt at this interview question may indicate:
  - a. Hearing impairment
  - b. Language barrier
  - c. Inattention, which may be a sign of delirium

**C0200 Conduct the Assessment<sub>1</sub>**

- Ask the question exactly as written.
- Immediately prompt for a response.
- If the resident repeats all three words correctly on the first attempt:
  - Reinforce recall by repeating the words with category cues.
  - This reinforcement is essential to evaluate the resident's ability to recall later in the interview.
  - Code the response.
  - Move on to the next interview question (C0300).

**INSTRUCTIONAL GUIDANCE**

**B. C0200 Conduct the Assessment**

1. Ask the question exactly as written on the MDS 3.0.
  - a. *“I am going to say three words for you to remember. Please repeat the three words after I have said all three. The words are: sock, blue, and bed.”*
2. Immediately prompt for a response after presenting the three words.
  - a. Say to the resident:
 

*“Now tell me the three words.”*
3. If the resident correctly states all three words on the first attempt:
  - a. Reinforce recall by repeating the words back to the resident with category cues.
  - b. Say *“That’s right; the words are sock, something to wear; blue, a color; and bed, a piece of furniture.”*
  - c. This reinforcement is essential to evaluate the resident’s ability to recall later in the interview.
  - d. So this repetition of the words with cues sets the foundation for the third component of the BIMS.
4. Code the response.
5. Move on to the next interview question (C0300).

### Category Cue

- A phrase that puts a word in context.
  - Helps prompt resident's recall ability.
  - Stimulates learning.
  - Fosters memory even among residents able to repeat the words immediately.
- Cues for C0200 are:
  - For sock: something to wear
  - For blue: a color
  - For bed: a piece of furniture
- May be provided verbally or in writing.

- C. Category Cue
1. If the resident does not remember the three words on the first attempt, let him or her try again and provide a category cue.
  2. A category cue is a phrase that puts a word in context.
    - a. Help with learning.
    - b. Serves as a hint that helps prompt the resident.
  3. Category cues for C0200 are:
    - a. Sock is “something to wear.”
    - b. Blue is “a color.”
    - c. Bed is “a piece of furniture.”

### C0200 Conduct the Assessment<sub>2</sub>

- If the resident recalls two or fewer words on the first attempt:
  - Make a second attempt.
  - Prompt using category cues.
- If the resident does not recall all the words on the second attempt:
  - Make a third attempt.
  - Repeat the words and use cues.




- D. C0200 Conduct the Assessment cont'd
1. If the resident recalls two or fewer words on the first attempt:
    - a. Make a second attempt.
    - b. When repeating the words, provide category cues to the resident to prompt his or her memory.
    - c. “Let me say the three words again. They are sock, something to wear; blue, a color; and bed, a piece of furniture. Now tell me the three words.”



2. If the resident still does not recall all three words correctly on the second attempt, repeat the words and category cues one more time.
3. If the resident does not repeat all three words after three attempts:
  - a. Reassess the resident’s ability to hear.
  - b. If the resident can hear, move on to the next question.
  - c. If the resident cannot hear, attempt to optimize hearing before proceeding.
    - Alter the environment.
    - Use a hearing amplifier.


E. C0200 Assessment Guidelines

1. The words may be recalled in any order and any context.
  - a. For example, if the words are repeated back in a sentence, this would be counted as repeating the words.
2. Score the number of words the resident repeats on the first attempt only.
  - a. Do not score the number of words the resident repeats on the second or third attempts at repeating the words.
  - b. Only the number of words the resident repeated correctly on the first attempt is included in the coding and in the Summary Score.


- c. The second and third attempts help with learning the item for the rest of the interview.
3. Do not record the number of attempts that the resident needed to complete this item.
4. On occasion, the interviewer may not be able to state the words clearly because of an accent.
5. Have a different staff member conduct this section of the interview if the interviewer is unable to pronounce any of the three recall words in C0200 clearly.
6. The BIMS may be conducted in writing in limited circumstances.
7. Consult Chapter 3 of the RAI Manual for guidance.

F. C0200 Coding Instructions

1. Record the maximum number of words that the resident correctly repeated on the first attempt only.
  2. This will be any number between **0** and **3**.
- **Code 0. None**
- If the resident did not repeat any of the three words on the first attempt


- **Code 1. One**  
If the resident repeated only one of the three words on the first attempt
- **Code 2. Two**  
If the resident repeated only two of the three words on the first attempt
- **Code 3. Three**  
If the resident repeated all three words on the first attempt

G. C0200 Scenario #1

1. The interviewer says, “The words are sock, blue, and bed. Now please tell me the three words.”
2. The resident replies, “Bed, sock, and blue.”
3. The interviewer repeats the three words with category cues, by saying, “That’s right, the words are sock, something to wear; blue, a color; and bed, a piece of furniture.”

4. C0200 Scenario #1 Coding

  - a. Correct answer is **D**. Code “sock” and bed as **0**. *No – could not recall*. Code “blue” as **1**. *Yes, after cueing*.

10. C0400 Practice #2 Coding
  - a. The correct coding is C0400A and C0400C as **0**. *No – could not recall* and C0400B as **1**. *Yes, after cueing*.
  - b. **C0400A (sock)**: The resident did not recall the item, even with a cue.
  - c. **C0400B (blue)**: The resident did recall after being given the cue.
  - d. **C0400C (bed)**: The resident did not recall the item, even with a cue.

Answer A. All terms are coded **0**. *No – could not recall because the resident initially stated she could not remember* is incorrect because you do not code the result of the resident’s first attempt for this component of BIMS.


- e. Answer **B**. All terms are coded **1. Yes, after cueing** because the resident required cueing to attempt recall for all of the terms is incorrect because coding is not dependent simply whether cueing is required to attempt recall.
- f. Answer **C**. All terms are coded **1. Yes, after cueing** because the resident remembered at least one term after cueing is incorrect because each term the resident is asked to recall is coded independently.



D. C0500 Assessment Guidelines

  - a. A score of 13 – 15 indicates the resident is cognitively intact.
  - b. A score of 08 – 12 indicates the resident is moderately impaired.
  - c. A score of 0 – 7 indicates the resident is severely impaired.



  4. Results of the BIMS are compiled into a Summary Score that is documented in C0500.
