Minutes of Meeting #124 February 11th, 2014

The Maine Public Drinking Water Commission (DWC) held its 124th meeting on Feb 11, 2014 at The Key Bank Plaza Augusta Maine

Present Were:

Members: Jeff LaCasse, Bob MacKinnon, George Dugovic, Lee Worcester and Roger Crouse

Guests: Jim Willis (Maine DWP)

Time: Jeff called the meeting to order at 9:15 am

A. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Approval of minutes from the last meeting occurred with the correction of Tom Brennan's name being removed from attending the December 4, 2013 meeting.

B. RECURRING BUSINESS:

1. AFM FEE AND COLLECTION STATUS

Roger provided the Commission Members with a summary of the AFM collection status. We currently have a 96.8 percent collection rate. Roger noted that we received more AFM payments in the month of July than ever before. Currently we have 81 systems that are delinquent. But overall we are on par from last year.

2. DWP FINANCIAL STATUS

Roger stated that spending this year is on par from previous years.

3. FEDERAL FUNDING PICTURE

Roger discussed projected budget estimates from the Federal Government. We are looking at the PWSS grant being a little lower or flat funded and DWSRF grants being slightly higher than last year.

Jeff reported that a letter was sent to Maine's congressional members, stating the importance of SRF. Jeff stated that he had a good response from all members.

4. SFY 2014 DWC ANNUAL OBJECTIVES- EPA/ASDWA RESOURCE NEEDS REPORT

Roger stated that the EPA has not decided not to release the Resource Needs Report instead ASDWA put out the report. Roger stated that we are currently covering all the bases ok and Report is not going any higher than the Maine Drinking Water Program.

5. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE /DWSRF STATE MATCH

Roger stated that the 2014 state match is still up in the air. With the current legislature and current governor there is little hope for another bond to get the state match. Roger has been working with the commissioner's office to find other alternatives to get our state match.

6. DWP STAFFING UPDATE

Roger stated that we currently have two vacant compliance officer positions. We have received permission to fill Lindy Moceus's old position and we are still waiting to fill Pam's Bryer's old position. Roger is asking human resources if we can direct hire the assistant Lab certification officer position. Roger stated we are still waiting to hear about the office specialist/supervisor position.

7. REVIEW OF CHARLESTON, WEST VIRGINIA WATER CONTAMINATION INCIDENT

Roger discussed the chemical spill in West Virginia. George asked about risk management in Maine. Roger also discussed a heating oil spill at the Hebron school.

8. DWC MEMBERSHIP UPDATE-REAPPOINTMENT STATUS

Lee Worcester is the only DWC member unappointed.
