DTaP:	Any child younger than age 7.
IPV:	Any child up through age 18.
MMR:	Any child age 1 through age 18.
Hib:	Any child up through age 5.
Hepatitis B:	Any child up through age 18.
Varicella:	Any child age 1 through age 18.
Pneumococcal Conjugate:	Any child up to age 5.
Hepatitis A:	Any child age 1 through age 18.
Rotavirus:	Any child up through age 32 weeks.
Tdap:	Any child age 10 up through age 18.
HPV:	Any child age 9 up through age 18.
Meningococcal:	Any child age 11 up through age 18.
Meningococcal B:	High-risk children, age 10 up through age 18. All children, age 16 up through age 18.
Pneumococcal Polysaccharide:	High-risk children, age 2 up through age 18.
Influenza:§	Children 6 months up through age 18.

Underinsured children in Maine do not need to be sent to a FQHC or RHC
to receive VFC vaccine. They can be vaccinated at your provider office.

§ Adult flu vaccine availability depends on funding availability.
