

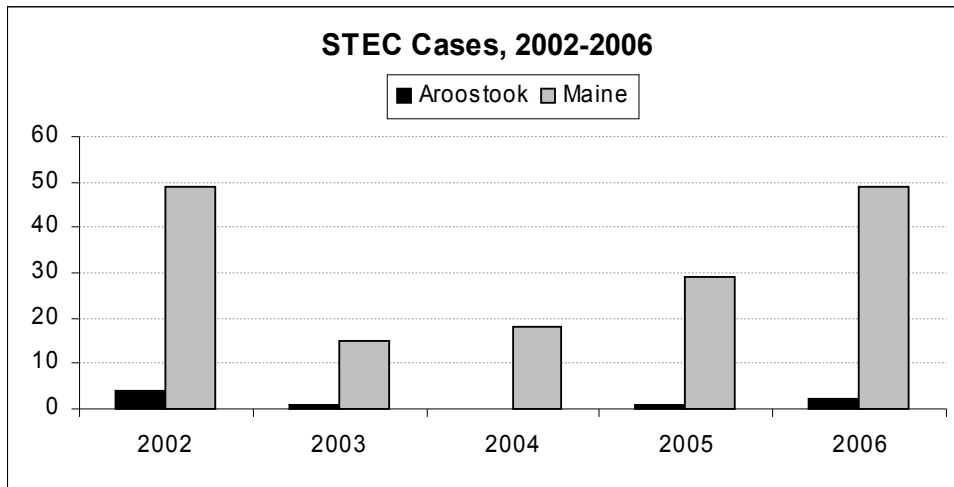
AROOSTOOK DISTRICT: Infectious Diseases

Shiga Toxin Producing E. coli (STEC)

STEC is a leading cause of foodborne illness in Maine. It is a source of the food-borne illness associated with the life-threatening hemolytic uremic syndrome (HUS), particularly in children under five years of age. It can result in death; and causes fear and disruption for communities and businesses.

Decreasing STEC infections is an objective of *Healthy Maine 2010*. The Infectious Disease Epidemiology Program tracks and monitors cases and provides education and technical assistance to clinical providers and communities. The Maine’s CDC’s Health Laboratory may assist with technical assistance as well.
