- 1. Identify most common workplace triggers and most at risk occupations where there are the greatest number of exposures.

- 2. What tools can we create for medical providers to help them make a definitive diagnose of work related asthma?

- 4. Identify partnerships that would be beneficial.
 - 4.1 Discussion Dave Wacker (BLS) has talked with OSHA. They will determine if there is a need for an *Emphasis Program*.
 - 4.2 Question. What if OSHA gets a complaint re: asthma? What are they doing? What does DEP do? What does BLS do?
 - 4.3 Action MORA will invite OSHA, DEP and BLS to a meeting to ask these questions, not only related to asthma but other conditions as well.

<u>Employee Associations</u> – AFLCIO, Change to Win(?), Maine Education Association, Maine Nurses Association, Respiratory Therapists, Asthma Educators, Industrial Hygenists, Safety Professional, Occupational Health. <u>Insurers</u> – all big workers comp insurers (MEMIC, Liberty Mutual), all big health insurers (Anthem, Aetna, Harvard Pilgrim).

<u>Risk Management</u> – Safety and health compliance officers, human Resources community, Facilities managers

<u>Training Organizations</u> – Maine Indoor Air Quality Council, Lung Association, New England Occupational Nurses organization.
