

SPF SIG Monthly Summary June 2009

Workgroups:

- **The Executive Management Team:** Did not meet this month. Next meeting is scheduled for July 1, 2009.
- **SPF Advisory Board:** Met on June 11, 2009.
 - Maine Integrated Youth Health Survey: 2009 implementation is completed. Will do follow-up calls on K-3 parents to try to increase participation in this segment.
 - Young Adult Drug & Alcohol Use Survey: Results for each district have been sent to the HMP's.
 - Upcoming Evaluation Activities: District Datasheets from information in KIT are being developed and will go out to each HMP. District profiles will be updated. The needs assessment guide will be revised into an evaluation guide this summer.
 - HEAPP: The survey tool is off line until next year. Currently analyzing the data.
 - Androscoggin Enforcement: Power Point Presentation covering enforcement work in Androscoggin County was highlighted. Demonstrated the data base the department uses to track violations, compliance checks, trainings, details, etc... Using this database would be beneficial for all police departments in Maine making the reporting process more uniform.
- **Community Epidemiology Surveillance Network:** Did not meet this month. Next Meeting (date TBD, Sept/Oct).

Other Items:

- **KIT PCW:** Met on June 12, 2009. Addressed input from grantees regarding any issues, concerns or changes; Strategy Tracker is not being filled out by all grantees consistently which are creating problems with the validity of the data. Coalitions are feeling as though strategy tracker is too specific and that they cannot put their counts into some of these places. A new version of strategy tracker will be released soon and trainings will be held to update coalitions on the changes.
- Site Visits have been completed.
- HMP Leadership Council Meeting was held on June 8, 2009 in Augusta.
 - Legislative session/budget updates and implications for local public health were discussed. Impact of the economy on HMPs and communities.
 - Universal Wellness pilot begins July 1, 2009.
 - Discussions around ideas and approaches for potential system-wide financial resource development beyond state government funding. Reviewed current funding formula, its background and the impact it has had. Changes to this formula were discussed.
- A TA Conference call on objective 3.11/pricing and promotion was held June 18, 2009.
- Began discussions regarding OSA's 6th Annual Prevention Provider Day to be held on November 5, 2009. This year's theme will be "Maines Prevention Workforce: Learning, sharing, developing & working." A call for proposals was sent out to grantees.
