Two Executive Committee (EC) meetings for York District Public Health Council (YDPHC) were held since the last SCC meeting. These meetings were held on May 2, 2012, and May 30, 2012.

The EC meeting on May 2, 2012 focused primarily on the review and update of District Health Report Card, feedback from YDPHC members on the SCC's proposed DCC Guidance and Operating Principles; and development of a draft agenda for May 30, 2012 Executive Committee Meeting. Time was also allotted for planning for the June 20, 2012 Healthy Homes Forum, rescheduled from the original date of April 4, 2012.

The May 30, 2012 EC meeting focused primarily on Community Transformation Grant (CTG) activities and updates. The CTG Coordinator is leading this section of the meeting and led planning efforts for the upcoming CTG deliverables and deadlines. Plans were also discussed for the June 20, 2012 full Council meeting where the YDPHC will host a Healthy Homes Forum for York District LHOs and YDPHC members in lieu of a regular business meeting at York County Community College.
