Brief review of decisions and outcomes from DCC meetings held since last SCC meeting (please attach agendas):

Two York District Local Public Health Council meeting were held since the last SCC meeting. They occurred on April 7 & June 2, 2010, please see the attached agendas. The April meeting served as the State Health Plan review and comment from over 20 participants. At the June meeting, members approved the Core Values and Strategic Goals for the York District Local Public Health Council and selected priority focus areas for the District Public Health Improvement Plan. Our executive committee has met on a monthly basis since our last SCC meeting and has been working with the district liaison to assist with the planning for the District Public Health Improvement Plan's planning process and on the final materials and marketing plan for of a York County volunteer Well Check Registry.

Ongoing or upcoming projects or priority issues:

The following items are upcoming projects:

- Recruitment of business and private sector membership
- Planning for the September 22, 2010 Council Meeting
- Continuation of our strategic work including the development of the Council's strategic plan
- Development of logo and branding for the York District Public Health Council
- Roll out of our voluntary Well Check Registry, including county wide information dissemination
- Creation of a District Public Health Improvement Plan once template is developed

The following are priority issues for YDPHC:

- Working with District HMPs on integrating health improvement plan efforts
- Convening of committee for our District Health Improvement Plan
- Engage Partners and Promote Voluntary Well-Check Registry
- Continue to partner with ME CDC Vaccine Coordinator on pandemic vaccine efforts

Status of Local Public Health System Assessment:

Preliminary results complete. Key finding are being integrated into the District Public Health Improvement Plan process and into the final report of the MAPP assessment phase.
