

Graph 5: Unmet Needs per 1,000 Open Cases All CSNs Compared To The State As A Whole: Quarter 2 (Oct-Dec '07) And Quarter 3 (Jan- Mar '08)

To compare across CSNs, the number of reported unmet needs was adjusted to show rates for 1000 open cases. For example if there are 500 cases, the rate per 1,000 cases would be twice the actual # of reports. If there are more than 1,000 cases, the number is adjusted proportionally down. The median is the middle value of the 7 regions. When there are a few values which are much higher or lower than the rest, medians are generally chosen (rather than average) to show the central value.

Possible Discussion items:
 Housing and Health Care and Financial Security continue to have the highest median reports per 1,000 cases. For MH Services, CSN2 and 3 declined, CSN 5 and 6 stayed about the same and CSN 1, 4 and 7 showed increases. The categories with the lowest reported unmet needs consistently have been: other resources, substance abuse services, legal resources and mental health crisis planning.
