



Past month substance use among Maine high school students, by substance type: 2011-2013





Substance use among Maine adults (18+), by type and gender: 2013




Percent of Maine women reporting alcohol and/or cigarette use during last three months of pregnancy: 2008–2012



Percentage of Maine women who reported drinking alcohol during last three months of pregnancy by age group: 2006-07 to 2011-12




Percent of Maine women who reported drinking alcohol during last three months of pregnancy, by income: 2007–08 to 2011–12


Total number of pregnant substance abuse treatment admissions in Maine: 2008-2014





Any illicit drug use in the past month among U.S. females 15 to 44, by age group: 2011-12 and 2013-14




Any illicit use in the past month among U.S. females 15 to 44, by age group and pregnancy status: 2013-14





Any illicit drug use within the past month among U.S. pregnant females 15 to 44, by trimester: 2013-13




Cigarette use in the past month among U.S. females 15 to 44, by age group and pregnancy status: 2013-14


Any alcohol use in the past month among U.S. females 15 to 44, by age group and pregnancy status: 2013-14



Binge alcohol use within the past month among U.S. pregnant females 15 to 44, by trimester: 2012-13






Number of Maine drug affected baby notifications: 2005-2014



Mental health among Maine female high students, by indicator type and gender: 2013





Mental health among Maine female high students, by indicator type: 2009-2013




