The State Innovation Model grant has been awarded to six states, including Maine. The grant was given to states that are well positioned to test and advance models to transform the health care system and Maine is a national leader in this area.

With the help of able community partners, the Maine Department of Health and Human Services will test new payment and service delivery models to determine if they can produce superior results in improving health, improving health care and lowering costs for Maine’s citizens through a sustainable model of transparency and multi-payer payment and delivery reform.

The State Health Care Innovation Plan is dedicated to delivering the right care, at the right time, in the right setting.

We believe this innovation will lower costs for all payers and bring better health outcomes to Maine people.

Timeline


- Fall 2012 Maine DHHS applied for SIM grant through CMMI
- Winter 2013 Maine is awarded \$33 million SIM Grant to test health innovation model
- Spring/Summer 2013 Planning and implementation phase of SIM grant
- Spring/Summer 2013 SIM Steering Committee Begins meeting
- Fall 2013-Fall 2016 Testing Maine’s State Health Care Innovation Plan to reform payment and delivery
