

NOTICE OF EMERGENCY RULE PROMULGATION

AGENCY: Department of Marine Resources

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: 12 M.R.S.A. Sections 6172 and 6192

RULE PROMULGATION: DMR Regulation 95.06 AA, Closed Area No. 24-A, Lower Salt Bay, Newcastle and Damariscotta:

TEXT OF RULE: DMR Regulation 95.06 AA, Closed Area No. 24-A, Lower Salt Bay, Newcastle and Damariscotta.

Effective immediately, because of pollution, it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters or mussels taken from the shores, flats and waters of the Damariscotta River, from May 15 through September 30, south of a line between two unnamed points of land, locally known as The Narrows, located approximately 600 yards north of the Route 1 bridge; AND north of the Route 1 bridge. From May 15 through September 30, this area is classified restricted and requires a special MDMR permit.

Violation of any provision of this regulation shall be a Class D Crime (12 M.R.S.A. Section 6204).



STATEMENT OF FACT AND POLICY

The Commissioner of the Maine Department of Marine Resources promulgates the new DMR Regulation 95.06 AA, Closed Area No. 24-A, Lower Salt Bay, Newcastle and Damariscotta. This new regulation describes the seasonal closure in Lower Salt Bay in the Damariscotta River, which was previously described in Closed Area No. 25. This area is no longer open year round for shellfish harvesting.



NOTICE OF EMERGENCY RULE REPEAL AND PROMULGATION

AGENCY: Department of Marine Resources

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: 12 M.R.S.A. Sections 6172 and 6192

RULE REPEAL AND PROMULGATION: DMR Regulation 95.06 F, Closed Area No. 25, Damariscotta River, Newcastle, Damariscotta, Edgecomb, So. Bristol, promulgated October 5, 2001 is repealed and replaced with the following rule:

TEXT OF RULE: DMR Regulation 95.06 F, Closed Area No. 25, Damariscotta River, Newcastle, Damariscotta, Nobleboro

1. Effective immediately, because of pollution, it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters or mussels taken from the shores, flats and waters of the Damariscotta River, north of a line between two unnamed points of land, locally known as The Narrows, located approximately 600 yards north of the Route 1 bridge.
2. Effective immediately, because of pollution, it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters or mussels taken from the shores, flats and waters of the Damariscotta River east of a line beginning at a red painted post located on the southwest tip of Jacks Point, Newcastle, then running southeast to Green Can #23, then running southwest to the southwest tip of Hall Point, Damariscotta; AND west of a line beginning at a point 600 yards northeast of Cottage Point, Damariscotta, then running northeast to the west tip of Norris Point; AND south of a line across the Route 1 bridge, Damariscotta.
3. Effective immediately, because of pollution, it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters or mussels taken from the shores, flats and waters of Days Cove in the Damariscotta River east of a line beginning at a point 600 yards northeast of Cottage Point, Damariscotta, then running northeast to the west tip of Norris Point. This area is classified restricted and requires a special MDMR permit.
4. Effective immediately, because of pollution, it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters or mussels taken from the shores, flats and waters of Huston Cove in the Damariscotta River east of a line beginning at the southwest of tip of Hall Point, Damariscotta, then running south to the south tip of Hog Island, then running east to the south tip of an unnamed point on the south side of the mouth of Huston Cove. This area is classified restricted and requires a special MDMR permit.

Violation of any provision of this regulation shall be a Class D Crime (12 M.R.S.A. Section 6204).



STATEMENT OF FACT AND POLICY

The Commissioner of the Maine Department of Marine Resources repeals the emergency DMR Regulation 95.06 F, Closed Area No. 25, Damariscotta River, Newcastle, Damariscotta, Edgecomb, So. Bristol, promulgated on October 5, 2001, and replaces it with a 2 new emergency regulations. The new regulation for Closed Area No. 25 describes 2 prohibited areas and 2 restricted areas in the Damariscotta River. The Damariscotta River is no longer conditional on the Great Salt Bay Wastewater Treatment Plant. The conditionally approved seasonal area above the Route 1 bridge is now described in DMR Regulation 95.06 AA, Closed Area No. 24-A.



NOTICE OF EMERGENCY RULE REPEAL AND PROMULGATION

AGENCY: Department of Marine Resources

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: 12 M.R.S.A. Sections 6172 and 6192

RULE REPEAL AND PROMULGATION: DMR Regulation 95.06 E, Closed Area No. 24, East Boothbay to Reeds Island, promulgated on November 9, 1989, is repealed and replaced with the following rule:

TEXT OF RULE: DMR Regulation 95.06 E, Closed Area No. 24, The Damariscotta River from Reeds Island to Meadow Cove, Boothbay.

1. Effective immediately, because of pollution, it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters or mussels taken from the shores, flats and waters westerly of a line beginning at the southernmost tip of Dry Point (Reeds Island), Boothbay, and running northeasterly (about 1.5 miles) to the most western prominence on Foster Point, South Bristol, then running northerly (about 1.4 miles) to the southern tip of Jones Point, South Bristol, then running northerly along the western shore of Jones Point (for about 400 yards) to a red post, then running northwesterly (about 0.85 miles) to a red post located on the northwestern shore of Meadow Cove, Boothbay. This last post is about 300 yards southeast of the south end of Gall Rock.

Violation of any provision of this regulation shall be a Class D Crime (12 M.R.S.A. Section 6204).

STATEMENT OF FACT AND POLICY

The Commissioner of the Maine Department of Marine Resources repeals the emergency DMR Regulation 95.06 E, Closed Area No. 24, East Boothbay to Reeds Island, promulgated on November 9, 1989, and replaces it with a new rule. This new rule enlarges the previous closure to include Meadow Cove. Meadow Cove lies about 1/2 mile northwest of the Village of East Boothbay on the western shore of the Damariscotta River.

Department personnel have determined that there is a licensed overboard waste water discharge in this cove. The probability of malfunction of this system poses a threat to the public health and consequently the harvest of clams, mussels, oysters and quahogs is prohibited in the cove area. The remaining portion of the closed area has many waste discharges as well as portions that are subject to intermittent pollution. These factors require prohibition of shellfish harvest to protect the public health.


