A = Allowed: Use or activity is generally permitted in these areas. This does not imply that facilities for listed activities will be provided in all areas within this classification.

S = Secondary: Use or activity allowed where they do not conflict with the dominant resource category values.

n = Use or activity generally not allowed except in some situations where the use or activity pre-dated application of the Resource Allocation System.

C/E - Existing roads and new trails allowed where (1) no safe, cost effective alternative exists, (2) the impact on the protected natural resource values or remote recreation values is minimal, and (3) the designated trail will provide a crucial link in a significant trail system.

(1) Pets not allowed in some Wildlife Management Areas.

(2) Timber Management allowed only where permitted by deed or statute.
