





Last USDA Monthly Survey for SY24!

The last USDA monthly survey for SY24 is April 1st-15th, bonus items will be offered, bonus means free items which are available first come, first serve. Items not taken by the Sponsor throughout the school year, will be shipped in May. Orders cannot be refused or sent back to the PFG warehouse once shipped.

What is left in your districts inventory?

Please check the Inventory tab on the Sponsor Summary page in CNPweb. The description and available quantity columns will show the items being shipped. If those columns are blank, then the items have been delivered throughout the year.


School Closure

If a school decides to close on a typical school day, this is not considered an "unanticipated closure, and waivers cannot be used to allow meals to be sent home.

One of the questions asked in the Q&A's about this is:

Can I use the waiver for planned remote days, such as professional development days or voting? No, these waivers are only for unanticipated closures. Planned remote learning days are not considered unanticipated.

Closing the school and using a remote learning day for the eclipse on April 8, 2024 is not a unanticipated closure. Any meals served on this day, would not be reimbursable in the NSLP, and would be paid for from a different funding source.



Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)

Just a reminder, the date to determine if your district/schools are eligible to participate in CEP is just around the corner, April 1st. All documents used to determine eligibility must be dated and must be around April 1st.

Paid Lunch Equity (PLE) School Year 2025

The PLE requirements apply to SFAs that charge students for meals.

On March 20, 2024, FNS released SP 14-2024, Paid Lunch Equity: Guidance for School Year 2024-2025. This memo provides guidance on the Paid Lunch Equity Requirements for School Year 2024-2025.

Only SFAs that charge students for meals and had a negative balance in the nonprofit school food service account as of June 30, 2023, shall be required to establish a price for paid lunches according to the PLE provisions.

SFAs that charge students for meals and have a positive or zero balance in the nonprofit school food service account as of June 30, 2023, are exempt from PLE pricing requirements. PLE Guidance Memo

Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program Fund Usage Report

We have received questions on where to check FFVP balances of schools. There is a report in CNP web called "FFVP Usage" that can be used to find the balance and shows the percent of funds spent to date. FFVP funds should still be monitored internally; however, this report can be used as a tool to compare against.

To access the report, take the following steps:

- 1. Go to the Reports tab in CNP web and click on "Accounting Reports".
- 2. Click on FFVP Usage report, then select School Year 2024 and District Name
- 3. Refer to the Balance column, and Oct-Sept. This will show the balance that each school has available to spend.

Non-Congregate portion of the Site Info Sheet

Help Maine Expand SFSP and SSO in Rural Areas!

The rural designations in the Summer Food Service Program and NSLP Seamless Summer Option have been revised! Please see the updated map here. A permanent non-congregate (meals to go) meal service option through the SFSP and SSO for children who live in rural communities with no congregate meal service was established through the Consolidated Appropriations Act. Non-congregate operations must be approved by Maine DOE in order to claim meals taken offsite. Additional SFSP/SSO eligibility criteria are in place as to what constitutes open sites and which meals can be claimed. The area eligibility map indicates which areas are open site eligible based on census tract data. School data can also be used. Please email adriane.ackroyd@maine.gov for more information, including how to operate non-congregate sites in rural areas that are not area eligible.

Management Plan

Due to a <u>final integrity rule</u> released by USDA, select Sponsors, including those who only operate SFSP, will be required to complete a new portion of the SFSP application — a Management Plan. The Management Plan template will be completed in CNPweb as part of the annual application to participate. The Management Plan is located in the checklist and instructions are in the help tab.

Important Deadlines

April 21, 2024: SFSP application deadline for those who receive USDA SFSP commodities

May 1 – 15, 2024: USDA SFSP Commodity Orders for those who receive commodities

June 2, 2024: SFSP application deadline for those who do not receive SFSP commodities

By start of operations – mandatory SFSP training must be completed for all staff

Edit Checks Webinar

March 25th @ 1:30pm

Edit checks are a required internal control measure where daily meal counts are compared to student enrollment. Prior to filing the claim for reimbursement, meal count edit checks must be performed. This webinar will review the requirements for counting and claiming reimbursable meals and completing daily edit checks.

Accountability Webinar

April 29th @ 1:30pm

Proper accountability is one, if not the, most important parts of running a school nutrition program. This webinar will review different accountability methods, including electronic point of service (POS), rosters, and tic sheets, and when to use them. We will also look at the pros and cons of each, as well as common accountability issues that are seen with administrative reviews.
