Procurement Review Report Sanford School Nutrition Program SY 2023

A review of the Sanford School Nutrition Department procurement practices from SY2022 was conducted to ensure compliance with Federal Regulations 2 CFR 200, 7 CFR 210, as well as applicable local laws.

<u>Code of Conduct</u>- Policy DJH – Purchasing and Contracting Procurement Staff Code of Conduct was reviewed. It is not compliant with 2 CFR 200.318(c)(1). A compliant policy:

- 1. Prohibits officers, employees and agents from soliciting or accepting gratuities, favors or anything of monetary value from contractors or parties of subcontracts;
- 2. Provides for disciplinary actions for violations by officers, employees, or agents;
- 3. Includes language that the SFA will neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, or anything of monetary value from contractors or parties to subcontracts, OR language with standards for situations when the financial interest is not substantial or the gift is unsolicited and of nominal value.

Required Corrective Action- Revise policy DJH to be compliant with federal regulations.

Date Due – December 30, 2022

<u>Procurement Procedures</u>- Policy DJE-R – Federal Procurement Administrative Procedure was reviewed. It is not compliant with 2 CFR 200.318 by exempting federal child nutrition programs (see #4 on the last page of the document). Federal child nutrition programs are required to follow the procurement regulations outlined in this manual.

Required Corrective Action- Revise the document by deleting the two bullets that exempt child nutrition programs from following these procedures.

Date Due - December 30, 2022

<u>Micro-Purchases</u>- Federal law requires that micro-purchases be reasonably priced and equitably distributed among qualified suppliers. No findings.

Small Purchases- N/A

<u>Formal Purchases</u>- The Sanford School Nutrition Department is in a member if the York-Cumberland buying group. Documentation for the solicitation and award of a prime vendor contract was reviewed. There are no findings.
