Adjustments to CRRSA ESSER 2 Applications

REMINDER: The only requests to alter the CRRSA ESSER 2 applications that will be permitted for Maine School Administrative Units (SAUs) are ones that are accompanied by a request from the OFERP invoice team to revise the application to align with allowable spending or a submitted invoice.

Liquidating ESSER 2 Funds

The liquidation period for CRRSA ESSER 2 is from October 1, 2023 to December 30, 2023. While the deadline for liquidation is December 30, 2023, SAUs are encouraged to submit invoices as early as possible to allow time for any necessary revisions.

AUDITORS ARE ON THE HUNT FOR ESSER FRAUD

This was the headline from a recent article published by EdWeek.org. You can read the full article here.

Here are just a few of the points made in the article:

- Some districts have failed to follow proper procedures for documenting or tracking investments.
- Scandals over spending federal dollars on schools have erupted in two states.
- The term "fraud" brings to mind embezzlement and corruption. But in school districts, it more often
 looks like "errors or omissions" that leave unanswered questions about where dollars went or who
 oversaw their movement. These often come as a result of staffers who simply don't understand or
 don't have the bandwidth to absorb every detail of the regulations.
- Construction spending has been particularly tricky for districts to manage. To comply with the law, districts are required to <u>prioritize materials produced in America</u> and <u>adhere to federal wage and benefit standards for construction workers</u>. These are just a couple of requirements related to construction and many districts are failing to meet those requirements.
- Auditors' oversight of federal spending will soon shift toward a sharper focus on outcomes. Did
 districts spend money in ways that made a meaningful difference for students and staff? Did they
 implement procedures to track the outcomes of their spending decisions? Are they able to easily
 demonstrate to auditors how they arrived at their conclusions?
