

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

The Maine Teacher of the Year represents the thousands of excellent educators in Maine. She or he serves as an advocate for the teaching profession, education and students.

The Teacher of the Year is announced in a surprise school assembly in September and the following January becomes an ambassador for teaching, speaking to teachers and community groups around the state.

The Teacher of the Year participates in the National Teacher of the Year Program, attending five national events, including Space Camp at NASA in Huntsville, Alabama, and a week in Washington, D.C., including an event at the White House.

Civic groups and associations sometimes ask the Teacher of the Year to serve on their boards or participate in their activities or offer advice.

Who is eligible to be nominated?

All Maine certified K-12 teachers are eligible to be nominated, from private schools as well as public schools.

Who can nominate a teacher?

Any teacher, parent, student, or community member may nominate a teacher by contacting the building principal who then convenes a committee to complete the nomination papers.
