Maine's Occupant Protection Laws

45% of highway deaths in Maine occurred to occupants who were unrestrained.¹

- All occupants in a vehicle must wear a seat belt. You can be fined \$50 for each person who is not buckled up.
- Children must ride in a rear-facing child restraint system until they turn two years of age.*
- Children who weigh 55 lbs. or less, must ride in a federally approved five-point harness child restraint system.*
- Children who weigh less than 80 lbs., are less than 4'9" in height, and are less than 8 years of age, must be in a booster seat.
- A child under 12 years old shall be properly secured in the back seat of the vehicle, if possible.

*Unless in rare circumstances, the child exceeds the child safety seat manufacturer's instructions, and no other option is available.
