Re: Falmouth Town Democratic Committee Investigation

On Monday, June 16, 2014, the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices received a complaint from Stephen M. Woods regarding the actions of the Falmouth Town Democratic Committee (FTDC) in endorsing his primary election opponent, Catherine Breen. Mr. Woods was a candidate for the Democratic nomination for Maine State Senate, District 25 covering Falmouth, Cumberland, Yarmouth, and nearby communities. He ran against Catherine Breen, who won the Democratic nomination in the June 10, 2014 primary election. Following preliminary fact-gathering by the staff, at its June 25, 2014 meeting the Commission voted to investigate whether the FTDC made a contribution to the Breen campaign through the endorsement or otherwise.

Relevant Law

Definition of Contribution

The raising and spending of money for candidate election campaigns is governed by Chapter 13, Subchapter II of the Election Law (21-A M.R.S.A. §§ 1011-1105). Candidates are required to file campaign finance reports of the contributions they have received and the expenditures they have made (§ 1017(5)). Donors may not make contributions in excess of certain limits. (§§ 1015(1) & (2))

This subchapter of the Election Law defines “contribution” as follows:

2. Contribution. The term "contribution:"

A. Includes:

- (1) A gift, subscription, loan, advance or deposit of money or anything of value made for the purpose of influencing the nomination or election of any person to state, county or municipal office or for the purpose of liquidating any campaign deficit of a candidate, except that a loan of money to a candidate by a financial institution in this State made in accordance with applicable banking laws and regulations and in the ordinary course of business is not included; ...

Thus, the term “contribution” covers a candidate’s receipt of money and non-monetary items (“anything of value”).

Exemption for Volunteer Activities and Voters Lists

The Legislature has exempted certain activities from campaign finance regulation. One such exemption is for volunteerism. (21-A M.R.S. § 1012(2)(B)(1)) Volunteerism can take many forms, but one common volunteer activity is designing or distributing communications urging support for a candidate. These activities can have tremendous value in building support for a candidate, but do not count toward disclosure requirements or contribution limits administered by the Commission. Another exemption is for lists of registered voters or voter identification information that a party committee has maintained for party building purposes and that are given by the party committee to a candidate who is a member of that party. (21-A M.R.S. § 1012(2)(B)(6))

Coordinated expenditures

Candidates have also accepted a contribution if they, their political committee, or their agents, have requested or suggested that someone else make an expenditure for the purpose of promoting their nomination or election.

- 5. Other contributions and expenditures.** Any expenditure made by any person in cooperation, consultation or concert with, or at the request or suggestion of, a candidate, a candidate’s political committee or their agents is considered to be a contribution to that candidate.

21-A M.R.S.A. § 1015(5)

Party committees. Local party committees are required to file up to three campaign finance reports during an election year, under 21-A M.R.S.A. § 1017-A(4-B) Any party committee receiving and spending less than \$1,500 in one calendar year is exempt from the duty to file reports. (21-A M.R.S.A. § 1017-A(4-B)(7))

Summary of Investigation

Following your June 25, 2014 meeting, the Commission staff

- interviewed Mr. Woods on June 26 and requested that he submit any additional written materials by July 4 (we received none)
- reviewed Mr. Woods' submissions, comments and interview responses (both of his written submissions prior to your last meeting are attached)
- interviewed Pam Fenrich, the Chair of the FTDC (notes are attached)
- interviewed Cathy Breen (notes are attached)
- sent a questionnaire and request for documents to FTDC treasurer Beth Franklin (her answers are attached, along with a redacted copy of the only check written by the FTDC this year which was unrelated to the Breen campaign)
- sent a questionnaire and request for documents to FTDC's secretary Grace Madden (her responses, including the email communications promoting Cathy Breen, are attached).

In an interview on June 27, 2014, Mr. Breen said that she did not invite or request the endorsement of the FTDC. When asked whether she was aware, in advance of the FTDC's May 28 meeting, that the FTDC might endorse her, she stated that endorsement had never crossed her mind. She found out about the endorsement the day after during a phone call with Pam Fenrich. The notes of the interview are attached.

In an interview on June 30, 2014, Pam Fenrich said that the FTDC met on May 28, 2014 to consider making endorsements in the upcoming primary election. Ms. Breen did not

solicit the endorsement of the committee. She recalls that the meeting was attended by 12 to 13 people, 4 to 5 of which were not involved with the Breen campaign. The motion to endorse Ms. Breen was made by Annalise Larson, a person Ms. Fenrich understood was not involved with the Breen campaign. Ms. Fenrich recused herself as Chair and abstained from voting. She recalls that the remaining voters were unanimous in voting to endorse Ms. Breen. The FTDC also voted to endorse Kevin Joyce.

After the meeting, Ms. Fenrich drafted the endorsement by relying on biographical text from Ms. Breen's campaign website. She then sent the endorsement email to Grace Madden, who sent the email out to the FTDC's email address list. The FTDC also distributed two other emails she drafted. One included endorsements of Ms. Breen by officials that Ms. Fenrich copied from the Breen campaign's webpage. (Ms. Fenrich sent the same email to about 30 of her personal contacts and encouraged them to forward the email.) The second email from the FTDC reminded recipients to vote on June 10th and encouraged them to vote for Ms. Breen and two others involved in Falmouth town races. The notes of the interview are attached.

Ms. Madden's written response is attached. Ms. Fenrich and Ms. Madden both said that the FTDC's email list had about 160 entries and was compiled by using sign-up sheets at meetings and events. Ms. Madden maintains this list on her personal email account and she is the only one with access to it.

In her July 3, 2004 written response, FTDC treasurer Beth Franklin stated that the FTDC did not spend any money creating or distributing the endorsement of Ms. Breen. It did not spend any money to support the Breen campaign. In fact, the FTDC's only expenditure during entire first half of 2014 was a reimbursement to its chair, Pam Fenrich, on February 19, 2014 for automated calls to invite FTDC members to a caucus meeting (redacted check is attached). The Commission staff reviewed the bank statements for the entire first half of the year and confirmed Ms. Franklin's statement. The FTDC treasurer also responded that the FTDC did not give the Breen campaign money or anything of value.

Staff Analysis and Recommendation

No evidence that Candidate Cathy Breen Received a Contribution under § 1012(2)(A)(1)

In applying the law, the Commission staff recommends focusing on how the Maine Legislature has defined the term “contribution.” The candidate should be held responsible for reporting money and “anything of value” that they have received, but not activities that are conducted independently of the candidate or that are deemed to be exempt by the Legislature.

Many actors are involved in a legislative race (including local party activists and the legislative caucuses) and they engage in a variety of actions that the candidate may not know about. Many of these activities “have value” in terms of persuading voters to nominate or elect a candidate, but they are not necessarily required by law to be reported as a contribution *by the candidate*. Since the Buckley v. Valeo decision, the federal courts have cautioned against limiting the activities of people and organizations acting independently of candidates in a race to affect their nomination or election.

The facts of the FTDC’s endorsement are straightforward. The Falmouth Town Democratic Committee is a typical municipal party committee that meets periodically to recruit candidates and to support their campaigns. The FTDC’s activities, the frequency of its meetings, the officers it has appointed to fulfill certain duties – all seem completely ordinary.

Cathy Breen has participated in activities of the FTDC in encouraging candidates to run and supporting their campaigns through volunteer activities. It is not surprising that she has gotten to know members of the FTDC, and that, individually, they might be inclined to support her nomination.

We are unable to find any evidence that Cathy Breen received any money or “anything of value” from the FTDC. The FTDC Chair (Pam Fenrich), the FTDC Treasurer (Beth Franklin) and Cathy Breen have denied this. Mr. Woods has complained about emails by

the FTDC that endorse or promote her, but he has not presented evidence that the FTDC gave her anything to promote her nomination. Based on the information received by the Commission staff, we recommend concluding that Cathy Breen did not receive a contribution under § 1012(2)(a)(1).

No evidence that Candidate Cathy Breen Received a Contribution under § 1015(5). There does not appear to be any evidence that Cathy Breen received a contribution in the form of an expenditure that was made at her request or with consultation or cooperation of her or political committee or agents.¹

No expenditure of money. The endorsement and its distribution by email were accomplished through no expenditure of money. A group of party activists responded to an emailed invitation to meet. One member of the group moved to endorse Cathy Breen. There was near unanimous support (the only exception being Pam Fenrich who abstained). The group also endorsed the nomination of a candidate for Cumberland County Sheriff.

Pam Fenrich drafted the email endorsement of Cathy Breen by relying on information on the Breen website concerning the candidate's biography. She sent the email to FTDC treasurer, Grace Madden, who maintains the email list on her AOL email account. Ms. Madden circulated the email the day after the meeting.

All of these activities may have "had value" in persuading the 161 recipients to vote for her, but there was no expenditure incurred in endorsing Ms. Brown or distributing the endorsement by email.

¹ In addition to the reasons stated below, we have found no evidence that Cathy Breen requested or suggested the FTDC endorsement. She has stated that the endorsement never crossed her mind, and we have found no evidence that would contradict that.

Non-monetary expenditures. The Commission staff cautions against any conclusion that the FTDC's use of its own email list, maintained by volunteers, could constitute an "in-kind expenditure" or a non-monetary expenditure.²

- First, contemporary communication techniques provide many opportunities for volunteers associated with a PAC or party committee to use electronic and personal property that has a resale value for purposes of a political communication (e.g., an email list, a personal computer, smartphone, video or still camera). The Commission has not adopted any rule or policy suggesting that *the use* of this property could constitute "an expenditure."
- In fact, the Commission has stated the opposite policy. In providing written guidance on independent expenditure reporting, the Commission addressed a hypothetical example of a community organization sending out an endorsement by email at no cost. The Commission's guidance was that no independent expenditure report would be required because the communication "involved no expense." (See attached advice document, page 5) The Commissioners approved this advice on February 25, 2010.
- Endorsements of candidates are a common activity within the political process. The Commission staff is concerned that if the Commission were to characterize a cost-free communication such as an email distribution of an endorsement as an expenditure, that policy could interfere with free expression of communications about candidates.

Conclusion

For the above reasons, we recommend finding that Cathy Breen did not receive a contribution from the Falmouth Town Democratic Committee. Thank you.

² The term "expenditure" is defined as

(1) A purchase, payment, distribution, loan, advance, deposit or gift of money or anything of value made for the purpose of influencing the nomination or election of any person to state, county or municipal office, except that a loan of money to a candidate by a financial institution in this State made in accordance with applicable banking laws and regulations and in the ordinary course of business is not included;

Political Committee and Lobbyist Registrar Ben Dyer and I interviewed Cathy Breen and today by telephone. This memo records my notes.

When asked to identify the people most involved in her campaign, Ms. Breen named the following:

- Elizabeth Klebe, campaign manager
- John Brautigam, treasurer
- Bonnie Rodden, communications director
- Rebecca Russell, worked on website
- Dee Vella, performed data entry
- Beth Franklin, driving coordinator (did not develop to be a large job; volunteers were arranged through a website)

I asked Ms. Breen whether she invited or requested the endorsement by the Falmouth Town Democratic Committee (FTDC). She replied "no." When asked whether she was aware, in advance of the May 28 meeting, that the FTDC might endorse her, Ms. Breen replied that it "never crossed my mind."

Cathy Breen said that she had volunteered for the FTDC in the past. She had served on the Falmouth Town Council, and because of term limits there was turnover on the Council and school board. The town needed "good people to serve," so she had gone to FTDC meetings to develop ideas for people who might agree to serve. When people agreed to run, she helped them. She tended not to go to the FTDC meetings, but asked

what she could do to help candidates, such as putting up campaign signs or providing transportation.

Cathy Breen said that that she did receive an email notifying her of the FTDC's May 28 meeting, but did not consider attending because she was too busy campaigning.

Ms. Breen first learned of that the FTDC had endorsed her on the day after the FTDC meeting, during a telephone conversation with Pam Fenrich. Ms. Fenrich mentioned that she had recused herself because of her position on the state committee.

Cathy Breen said that she did not know whether Elizabeth Klebe, John Brautigam, or Bonny Rodden had attended the FTDC's June 28 meeting. She expressed doubt that Ms. Klebe had attended. Ms. Breen described her as highly skilled at organizing (an "uber-volunteer"), but not political. She said that she had not seen the minutes of the meeting and did not know who was there. When asked whether she was aware that John Brautigam and Bonny Rodden had been at the meeting, she said no.

I asked Ms. Breen whether she had any information indicating that people in her campaign may have requested, suggested, or initiated the endorsement by the FTDC, she replied "not that I'm aware of."

Ms. Breen said that no one on her campaign wrote the language of the endorsement, and that she does not know if the campaign posted the endorsement to its Facebook page.

The FTDC did not provide any money or anything of value to the candidate or campaign, and did not provide the FTDC's email list to the campaign. Ms. Breen is not aware of the FTDC spending any money to promote her campaign. The Breen campaign did not give any lists of emails to the FTDC.

We thanked her and terminated the interview.

Re: Notes of Interview of Pamela Fenrich

Political Committee and Lobbyist Registrar Benjamin Dyer and I interviewed Pam Fenrich today by telephone. This memo records my notes of her responses.

When asked when she first served as Chair of the Falmouth Town Democratic Committee (FTDC), Ms. Fenrich replied that she believes that it was in 2007. In 2006, she was elected as Vice Chair of the FTDC. She had no involvement in political campaigns in Maine before 2006. She remembers chairing a very large meeting of the FTDC in the fall of 2008, when Barack Obama was the Democratic nominee for U.S. President.

The FTDC meets between one and four times a year, depending on the election schedule. When Fenrich first became chair, she attempted to hold regular meetings, but she discovered that people didn't have time to meet every month. The FTDC moved to meeting for more specific purposes, such as recruiting or supporting candidates in upcoming elections. The Maine Democratic Party is required to hold a certain number of municipal caucuses every two years. The FTDC held its 2014 caucus on March 2, 2014.

Pam Fenrich did not have a named position in Cathy Breen's campaign. Cathy Breen is a close friend, and Ms. Fenrich provided informal advice to her as a candidate.

The motion to endorse Cathy Breen during the FTDC's May 28, 2014 meeting was made by Annalise Larsen. She is not involved with the Breen campaign, to the best of Ms. Fenrich's knowledge. Ms. Larsen did not state her motivation for the motion in the course of making it. Ms. Fenrich recalled the motion as "I would move that the Committee endorse Cathy Breen."

Pam Fenrich recused herself from the vote, because she had said that she would not do anything publicly as the Vice Chair of the State Committee to support Cathy Breen.

Pam Fenrich believes that 12 or 13 people were present at the May 28 meeting. Some of the people present had volunteered for the Breen campaign occasionally. John Brautigam and Bonny Rodden were more involved. She estimates that at least four or five "had nothing to do" with the Breen campaign.

Ms. Fenrich had a clear sense that everyone in the group supported Cathy Breen. The vote was unanimous. Pam Fenrich was the only member who abstained.

The FTDC also voted unanimously to support Kevin Joyce for Sheriff, as people were upset about the negative campaign in support of his opponent. Ms. Fenrich also recused herself from that vote.

In order to prepare the FTDC's written communication endorsing Cathy Breen, Pam Fenrich went to Cathy Breen's campaign website. Ms. Fenrich took descriptions from the biography section to create the language of the FTDC's endorsement. She did not think she added a lot to the message. After finishing the endorsement, Ms. Fenrich sent it to the Secretary of the FTDC, Grace Madden, to distribute the message to the FTDC email list. Ms. Mullen distributed the email endorsement on May 29, 2014.

Cathy Breen did not know of the endorsement before or during the meeting. Ms. Fenrich thinks that she called Ms. Breen afterwards to tell her of the endorsement by the FTDC.

When asked if, to the best of her knowledge, no one in the Breen campaign requested the endorsement, Ms. Fenrich responded "correct."

After Grace Mullen sent the FTDC endorsement, Ms. Mullen sent two other emails in support of Breen to the FTDC email list. Fenrich prepared both of the additional emails. The first reiterated endorsements that Cathy Breen had received from elected officials. This email was the same as the email that Pam Fenrich sent to the 30 or so people in her contact list. The second email was a flier to vote for Breen, Caleb Hemphill (School Board), and Chris Orestis (Town Council).

The FTDC keeps a list of email addresses that are provided by individuals who have attended FTDC's meetings or house parties. The usual method of receiving them is to set

out a clipboard to meetings and house parties with a sheet asking if people want to sign up to receive emails.

The current list includes 161 entries. The list is kept in Grace Madden's AOL account. The names are not stored in some other format such as Microsoft Excel or Constant Contact.

The FTDC has not used NGP VAN information for purposes of emailing messages to members of the FTDC. Candidates for Town Council and School Board have accessed the data for campaign purposes, such as canvassing voters. Pam Fenrich has access to the VAN, but has not used it for the distribution of emails.

The email from Ms. Fenrich to her personal contact list concerning Cathy Breen went to about 30 people and may have gone outside Falmouth to about 30 people. The email contained language encouraging people to forward the email to friends and neighbors, so others may have received it.

The FTDC did not give money or anything of value to the Breen campaign. The FTDC did not spend money to promote Breen's nomination.

The Cumberland County Democratic Committee endorsed Cathy Breen around June 7 or 8, 2014.

The FTDC sent email communications endorsing Kevin Joyce and town council candidates. In response to our request, Ms. Fenrich said that she would forward those emails.

We thanked her and terminated the interview.





- Please identify whether Pam Fenrich or Bonnie Rodden had any position or role in Cathy Breen's election campaign. By requesting their "position or role," I am asking that the campaign please disclose any campaign title that they had ("campaign manager" or "chair"), and a brief description of any activities they conducted as part of her campaign.

The request is relevant to the issue of whether there is any possibility that Ms. Breen received a contribution in the form of a coordinated expenditure of non-campaign funds. I understand that no such expenditures may have been made, but the information concerning Ms. Fenrich and Ms. Rodden would be helpful nevertheless.

Advice Regarding Independent Expenditures for the 2012 Elections

This memo answers some frequently asked questions about whether independent expenditure reporting is required. A copy of the relevant law (21-A M.R.S.A. § 1019-B) is attached with the corresponding Commission rule regarding independent expenditures. For advice about how to file an independent expenditure report, please see the instructions on the reporting form.

What is an "independent expenditure?"

Independent expenditures are payments or obligations made by individuals and organizations, acting independently of candidate campaigns, for certain communications referring to clearly identified candidates.

More specifically, payments or obligations made for communications (for example, advertisements in print or on television or the Internet, literature, robocalls) that expressly advocate the election or defeat of a candidate are always considered independent expenditures.

In addition, payments or obligations made for communications are presumed to be independent expenditures if the communication 1) is disseminated within 21 days before a primary election or within 35 days before the general election, 2) names or depicts a clearly identified candidate, and 3) involves a race in which a Maine Clean Election Act certified candidate is running.

These two periods before an election are referred to below as the "presumption periods."

Presumption Periods for the 2012 Elections		
Election	Length (includes election day)	Dates
Primary	21 days	May 23 – June 12
General	35 days	October 3 – November 6

Some communications are exempt from the presumption, such as slate cards sent by political party committees (please see exceptions below).

How do I know if my advertisement or literature "expressly advocates" the election or defeat of a candidate?

The term "expressly advocate" is defined in Chapter 1, Section 10(2)(B) of the Commission rules, which is attached to this memo. The definition includes phrases such as "Jones for House of Representatives" or "Vote for the Governor," and other words which in context can have no reasonable meaning other than to urge the election or defeat of one or more clearly identified candidates.

The Commission will take into consideration any evidence relevant under the statute, including the following:

- Does the language of the communication appear designed to influence the nomination, election, or defeat of a candidate?
- Was the communication disseminated to voters in the district of the candidate(s) mentioned in the communication?
- Was the communication disseminated to voters in other districts?
- How many voters received the communication?
- Is the communication directed to voters at all?
- Does the communication seem primarily designed for some identifiable purpose other than influencing the nomination, election, or defeat of a candidate?
- Does the communication mention all candidates running in the district?
- When was the communication produced, and when was it distributed?

The Commission will consider each rebuttal statement on a case-by-case basis. The determination will depend on the factors listed above, and any other evidence deemed relevant by the Commission.

What if the cost of a communication is less than \$100 per candidate?

The definition of independent expenditure applies only to expenditures for communications. If the person making the communication did not spend or obligate more than \$100 per candidate to design, produce, or disseminate the communication, no independent expenditure report or rebuttal statement is necessary. However, once the aggregated costs for any candidate exceed \$100, a report must be filed for communications regarding that candidate.

Example: a community organization maintains a list of e-mail addresses of individuals who are concerned about local economic development issues. At no cost, it sends an e-mail to the concerned citizens endorsing a legislative candidate. The organization would not be required to file an independent expenditure report or submit a rebuttal statement because the communication involved no expense.

Please note that if an organization uses materials produced by another entity (e.g., a legislative scorecard), the cost of producing that material must be included in the total amount for that communication (see below).

Are there any expenditures that are exempt from the reporting requirement and the rebuttable presumption?

Certain election-related activities are excluded from the legal definition of "expenditure" or "independent expenditure" in the Election Law. They do not need to be reported as independent expenditures and the rebuttable presumption does not apply to them. These excluded costs include:

- News stories and editorials distributed through a broadcasting station, newspaper, or other periodical publication, unless the facilities are owned or controlled by any political party, political committee, candidate or candidate's immediate family;
- Any communication from a membership organization (e.g., a union or trade association) or corporation to its members or stockholders if that organization is

Jonathan,

I'm writing to file an official ethics complaint against the following;

- Cathy Breen – State Senate Candidate for State Senate #25
- Pam Fenrich – Chairwoman of the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" and Vice Chair of the Maine Democratic Party
- Ben Grant – Chairman of the Maine Democratic Party
- The Maine Democratic Party, as an organization

In short, since approximately March, 2014 or before, the above mentioned individuals and the MDP as an organization, conspired and acted with deliberate intent to sabotage my campaign for State Senate #25 through multiple acts that will be detailed later.

For now, I'm asking the Maine Commission on Ethics and Governmental Practices to investigate the following act that had a material impact on the June 10, 2014, election for SD#25. (A chain of email correspondence is included below.) On at least one occasion (June 5th email included below) – the Cathy Breen campaign organized and executed a strategy that included sending out communications (email blasts, etc.) to all known registered Democrats in SD#25 with blatantly false and misleading information. One such communication purported that the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" had officially "endorsed Breen as a candidate."

In "minutes" provided by MDP Chair, Ben Grant, (attached) on June 9th, it is suggested that on May 28th, that the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" met as a formal political organization and "voted" to endorse Breen. It is my contention that this group had no lawful authority to make such an "endorsement" and that both candidate Breen and the MDP knew that at the time – and furthermore, all parties knew that such an "endorsement" absent legal basis – was instead a deliberate campaign act under the control of the Breen campaign itself.

In order to more fully understand the scope and scale of this event, I'm asking the Maine Commission on Ethics and Governmental Practice to investigate and to provide the following information ASAP, as time is of the essence;

- By what legal authority does the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" exist? (Charter, filings, etc.)
- Given that it appears that everyone at the May 28th meeting was directly associated with the Breen campaign, who in total attended this "meeting?"
- At what time of day on May 28th did this meeting start? End?
- Which members in name – actually "voted" to endorse Breen? Exactly who was at this meeting?
- Was candidate Breen in attendance to any part of this meeting where the "endorsement vote" occurred?
- Given that this meeting was presented as being an official function, where did the meeting take place? Cathy's house?

-How was this meeting "noticed" to the public? If it wasn't "noticed" how would my supporters know to attend?

-Was a quorum reached in the vote -- and where in the published charter are the quorum requirements?

-What other official "meetings" and votes have been taken by the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" over the last 12-months? Where are those "minutes" and how are those records kept and shared with members and the public?

-Why did Pam Fenrich "recuse" herself as indicated in the "minutes?" For what reason? And, if her reason was to fulfill a directive from the MDP, why then broadcast a destructive email about me -- in support of Cathy Breen -- just days before the election?

-Does the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" have any recorded revenue or expenditures from the last 12-months? Details?

-Where did the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" attain their email list as referenced below? (Please ask them for a copy of the list used.)

-Who with the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" has access to the contact list used? Did/does anyone associated with the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" have access now (or anytime in the past) to the MDP's "VAN" list of voters -- in any part or manner?

-Where did Pam Fenrich receive or acquire her email list that was utilized? (Please ask for a copy of this list.)

I don't believe that the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" meets any reasonable standard for being a legitimate organization. And, it certainly didn't act independent to the Breen campaign -- as it appears that everyone in attendance was associated with Breen directly.

Instead, I believe that they functioned over the last month (and longer) as a direct campaign organization for candidate Cathy Breen in direct violation to existing election law and general standards of ethics. And, that Maine Democratic Party Chairman Ben Grant, and the MDP as a whole, was aware of this reality. In addition, after Pam Fenrich "recused" herself -- it was recorded that John Braultigan "presided in her place" (Breen's registered campaign Treasurer) and then later, Bonny Roddon (well established as Breen's active campaign manager) was named "temporary secretary" and then sent out email to all registered Dems in the area.

I believe that answers to the above questions will prove that election law was broken and that Maine ethics violations occurred. I also believe based upon information provided to me through a number of concerned people - that this matter in totality represents a conspiracy in regard to the multiple parties involved and the attempted cover-up and deliberate misstatement of fact(s.)

Given the small voter turnout anticipated and achieved this past election -- a turnout comprised of a high concentration of active democrats in SD#25 and in Falmouth (itself approx. 50% of voters) -- an "official" email just days before the primary election -- one from the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" and one from "Pam Fenrich" the well-known Vice Chair of the MDP and the Chair of the "Falmouth Democratic Party" -- with the subject line notice -- "Falmouth Democratic Committee and Lots of Others Endorse Cathy Breen" -- had a material impact on the outcome of the election. And, beyond being illegal and blatantly unethical, it was wrong.

Much like on May 27, 2011 in the linked Op-Ed Breen wrote for the PPH about a Falmouth Referendum - <http://www.pressherald.com/2011/05/27/falmouth-needs-the-new-facilities-that-question-1s-approval-will-bring-2011-05-27/> - The "wrong" part, a few days later, her husband (Jay Geller) followed Breen's Op-Ed with a Letter to the Editor that intentionally went out of his way to hide his identity as Breen's husband with the complimentary words, "After reading Councillor Breen's column on Falmouth's Question 1, this question appears to be a well-conceived

business initiative by the town." <http://www.pressherald.com/2014/06/04/falmouth-town-center-draws-support-from-residents-2014-06-04/> Who does that? Who has their spouse write letters of support behind the veil of seeming anonymity with the added deceit of feigned impartiality? What a clever way to capitalize on having a spouse with a different last name! Also, who ghost-writes multiple "Letters to the Editor" for her "supporters" that barely even know her? (My research is showing - and documenting - a pattern of deceptive practices.)

Finally, this matter is only one area of concern in regard to the Breen campaign. There are numerous other issues that range from impropriety to ethics violations that I will be forwarding in due course - as I compile affidavits, statements, and further details. For now, the timeliness of your Ethics inquiry associated with my request here - is critical given the election calendar and any hope of remedy. As you'll note below, my attempt at asking Ben Grant and the MDP for assistance here was met with the suggestion that I actually ask the same people that I'm accusing of violations for the actual details needed to prove these specific claims.

You wrote the phrase, "...the facts as I (you) understand them.." twice below. How about "truth?" How about "honor?"

Yesterday was a family day for me (i.e. no cell phone monitoring), so I did not get your message or email until last night. I spoke with Pam at that point to get the facts from her end, and then wasn't able to reach Justin until this morning. The facts as I understand them are that the Falmouth Town Dem. Committee had a motion from the floor at their most recent meeting to endorse in the SD25 race. At that point, Pam recused herself from the proceeding, and the vote was taken. They voted to endorse Breen, as you know. Then, the Secretary of the Committee (not Pam) wrote and sent out the email you forwarded to me. It was sent to the Town Dem list. Ben, Justin, & Matt,

The email attached below is UNBELIEVABLE. It was sent out as an email blast to registered democrats in SD#25 two-days ago.

I literally cannot believe that the Vice-Chair of Maine's Democratic Party sabotaged my primary campaign with a blast email just a few days before the election – when it is most damaging.

Ben/Justin – back in early March I wrote the attached complaint to you both. And all three of us had follow-up call to discuss the situation in detail. And you both PROMISED me that Pam would be a "non-factor" in my campaign for SD#25 and you encouraged me to continue my campaign. Well, now where are we? Not only is Pam clearly not "dark" (silent) now – she has taken a step as the second highest "officer" (Vice Chair) of Maine's Democratic Party to publically "endorse" my opponent – and to make matters worse – she parleys her own endorsement with those from others too. Over the last year I've generously donated to the MDP whenever asked, why? Since last July I've supported, collected signatures and campaigned actively for Mike Michaud, why? 

Jonathan,

Thank you for sending along your overview of my complaint with the Commission. Being respectful of your time and the Commissioner's time, I want to add some additional measure of detail and clarity to your report in advance of tomorrow's (Wednesday, June 25th) hearing.

Firstly, I understand that the State of Maine Ethics Commission must make a singular determination before even weighing the specific allegations of my complaint; does this matter fall under the jurisdiction of the Commission?

I believe unequivocally that the answer to that question is "yes." (Here are a few of the reasons.)

- 1) Senator Justin Alford is a current member of the Maine State Legislature, currently serving as Senate President and his direct and active involvement in this matter qualifies this review and hearing by the Commission. (Documents clearly reveal that Pam Fenrich's numerous "unethical" and "illegal" actions on behalf of candidate Cathy Breen were conveyed to Senator Alford as of March 4th, 2014, when Maine Democratic Party Chairman, Ben Grant, wrote, "As I told you on several occasions, I confer with Sen. Alford on any issues relating to State Senate races." This and many other documents & statements will establish that Senator Alford was very much involved in this matter for many months – and as such, it meets your jurisdictional requirement. In the course of an investigation by the Maine Ethics Commission, I intend to present evidence showing that Sen. Justin Alford played a significant and material role in the outcome of the SD#25 2014 election.
- 2) Campaign Finance. While it is true that the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices has a primary focus on matters that involve "finance," monetary actions, and public reporting, the charter and greater public policy interests, all go beyond simple math, numeric metrics, and banking. The legal principle that's central to Maine Law and established legal case law is "value" – which often is represented in financial instruments, goods, services, and intrinsic "benefit" derived from one's deliberate action(s). In this case, I believe that the Cathy Breen campaign received direct and significant financial/value/services "benefits" from coordinated efforts under the control of the campaign. To limit your recommendation, or for the Commission to rule on this matter, based upon the narrow standard of "expenditure of funds" would be myopic and contrary to established Federal Law. In the course of an investigation by the Maine Ethics Commission, I intend to present evidence showing that the Breen campaign directly benefited in a significant and material manner from the coordinated actions by Pam

Fenrich, and others – and those “actions” equated to thousands-of-dollars in value to the Breen campaign that was not reported.

- 3) Advertising (part a), It is most common in the political realm to assign “value” and expenditures to what is commonly referred to as “measured media” (i.e. print, radio, television, etc.) It is also commonly accepted that “advertising” is a vital element in political campaigns. In the course of an investigation by the Maine Ethics Commission, I intend to present evidence showing that the Breen campaign directly benefited in a significant and material manner from various “advertising” elements produced and exported by Pam Fenrich, and others – and that those “advertising elements” equated to thousands-of-dollars in value to the Breen campaign that was not reported. One example; Pam Fenrich admits to sending out email messages to various targeted recipients (likely democratic primary voters) on June 5, 2014, 9:59am with the headline of, “Please forward to your friends and neighbors.” This cannot be construed to be a “personal message” from Fenrich – or a personal “endorsement” by Fenrich – in that it represented an existing formatted message (supposedly from the “Falmouth Democratic Committee”) that was allegedly blindly forwarded by Fenrich with no modification or personalization from Fenrich herself – the very definition of “*advertising*.” By forwarding a pre-existing message – Fenrich became the advertising vehicle – not a passive supporter – an “action” that equated to thousands-of-dollars in value to the Breen campaign that was not reported.
- 4) Advertising (part b), On June 10th, the Breen campaign knowingly broke Maine election law (Maine Statute, Title 21-A, Section 681 – Chapter 9: Conduct of Elections and Subchapter 2: Election Procedure and Article 4: Restrictions) - through the repeated use of family members, friends, Pam Fenrich and others – to serve as “advertising” surrogates during the actual election at multiple voting places (Yarmouth, Cumberland, Gray, Falmouth, etc.)

In the course of an investigation by the Maine Ethics Commission, I will provide evidence, supported by my own direct observations, observations by my campaign staff, observations by other candidates, and finally, as witnessed by Falmouth, Town Clerk & election Registrar, Ms. Ellen M. Planer.

On Election Day, Tuesday, June 10, 2014, candidate Cathy Breen dispatched a number of family members, friends and supporters to various “Voting Places” to actively “advertise” her candidacy to voters as they were entering the various voting location in SD#25. What each of these surrogates said was along the lines of; “Hi...I’m Cathy Breen’s husband...” Or “Hi...I’m Cathy Breen’s daughter...” These interactions/conversations occurred throughout the entire Election Day – sometimes with Breen present – sometimes not. In addition, Breen campaign staff/supporters, Bonny Rodden and Pam Fenrich, also spent time engaging voters as they were entering the various voting places.

Maine law is very clear and detailed in this regard. The core principle of election law is to eliminate outside “influence” during the voting process and to allow all voters unfettered access

to the voting place. In regard to allowed "Political Activities," the law is specific to "candidates" and candidates only in terms of what detailed voter engagement is allowed and legal.

"These limitations do not prohibit a candidate from attending the voting place and orally communicating with voters as long as the candidate does not attempt to influence their vote. A candidate may not state the name of the office sought or request a person's vote."

Nowhere in the statute are family members, friends of surrogates mentioned as having any rights to engage voters – as it is intentionally written for "candidates" only – with ALL others exempt from ANY role in the process. (For anyone to suggest that the absence of language addressing non-candidates in relation to them affirmatively participating in voter engagement on election day -- would be absurd and illogical. Such an argument would then support & allow campaigns from enlisting or hiring hundreds of supporters to show up on election day to "engage" voters.)

Election law is deliberately prescriptive and rigid in regard to candidate messaging at the polling place (no campaign materials, no discussion of office being pursued, etc.) The principle for such vigilant election control is to insure that voters are not confronted with uncomfortable interactions or information within minutes & feet – from actually voting.

In my case, election law precluded me from wearing a single, simple 2-inch lapel button that said "Steve Woods for State Senate" – but Cathy Breen was allowed to have a living/breathing 5'8" campaign message in the form of Pam Fenrich standing right next to her as voters entered the polling place. Also, Breen was allowed to have thousands of interactions from her family members with voters? (i.e. direct advertising) Both of those deliberate actions by the Breen campaign represent material and significant violations of election law as they clearly were committed with the willful intent to circumvent this passage, "*...as long as the candidate does not attempt to influence their vote...*" (if not to "influence" a vote(s) – than why even employ family members and Fenrich to engage voters on Election Day? Obviously, that was the sole "intent" and expectation.)

It's well established that "symbols" are recognized as elements of communication. And the symbol of Pam Fenrich (a non-candidate for anything herself) standing next to Breen at the polling place was clearly a message to many voters, "Hi, I'm Pam Fenrich, Vice Chair of the Maine Democratic Party, Chair of the Falmouth Democratic Committee, well known as an iconic democratic activist in Falmouth and throughout Maine – standing next to candidate Breen within inches of the doorway leading into the voting booths – within days of having just sent out an email communication aggressively supporting Breen" – is a clear and compelling message. (When a well-known professional athlete is viewed holding a Gatorade – it's "advertising" even without any additional messaging, based simply on proximity. Same with Fenrich deliberately standing next to Breen.)

In fact, such "advertising" (Paragraph 3) is explicitly identified as a Class E "crime." (It is well established case law and brand marketing practice that merely mentioning "Cathy Breen" can

and should be considering "advertising" under the statute – even in the absence of a more detailed message, such as "Vote for Cathy Breen." Just the mention of "Cathy Breen" by anyone other than a candidate himself/herself is advertising by any standard – and when it occurred a few minutes before voting – and few feet from the voting booths – it had a material and deliberate effect that was premeditated and intentional. (Just as a Coca-Cola sign is an effective "advertising" element in front of a store.)

It is my position that this is clear violation of Maine election law, which only (and appropriately) gives limited provisions for "candidates" themselves to greet voters. The absence of "family members" in the statute can only be viewed as an intentional element of the law. Otherwise, candidates with large families (20-30 members) would be at a distinct advantage over a candidate with a small family or, no family.

I've been an advertising/marketing executive for more than 30-years and I know first-hand that brand/name recall is critically important in all purchase/voting situations – especially when they occur within minutes and feet from the decision.

In the case of the recent election here in State Senate #25, the Breen campaign had an unfair advantage as they were allowed to openly break election law in a manner that impacted the election results. Now, given that thousands of Breen family interactions were all in violation of Maine election law – and it can only be reasonably concluded that this violation was committed intentionally and in itself, this in itself should call into question the results of the June 10th election.

The statute calls for the penalty (Class E crime) of up to six months of incarceration and \$1,000 fine per occurrence. It should be noted that yesterday, I asked Julie Flynn, Deputy Secretary of State, to investigate this claim through the Bureau of Elections – and to delay certification of SD#25 results pending such investigation.

- 5) Undue/Illegal Influence by Pam Fenrich. My first interaction with Pam Fenrich occurred on February 12, 2013. I met with Fenrich in her role as Vice-Chair Maine Democratic Party – a meeting in which Fenrich berated me for my early consideration to participate in the 2014 Gubernatorial Democratic primary. In that meeting, and in multiple other meetings with Ben Grant (MDP-Chair) I was openly told that the Democratic Party would actively block any Democrat wanting to run in the 2014 primary until after Mike Michaud or Chellie Pingree, made respective decisions to run or not. This status changed slightly when I was effectively forced to sign a contract (MOU) with the MDP on July 13, 2014, pledging my support for Mike Michaud in exchange for me being allowed by the MDP to campaign – pending Michaud's decision. Since that time, Pam Fenrich has actively used her power and influence as the leader in various political organizations (Maine Democratic Party, Cumberland County Democrats, Falmouth Democratic Committee, etc.) to act with malice towards me personally and politically.

In the course of an investigation by the Maine Ethics Commission, I intend to present clear and compelling evidence showing that the Breen campaign directly and knowingly benefited in a

significant and material manner from the coordinated unethical and illegal actions by Pam Fenrich. Furthermore, those "actions" equated to thousands-of-dollars in value to the Breen campaign that was not reported. And of material fact, most of my allegations against Pam Fenrich (and the Breen campaign) were communicated (written & verbal) to MDP Chairman Ben Grant, and Senate President Justin Alford, on many occasions -- with an email sent on March 3, 2014, 4:11pm, being very detailed. Despite my clear request that Senator Alford act upon my complaint on that date -- to my knowledge he did nothing.

A few examples:

On 1/28/14 -- Pam Fenrich signed a Primary Nomination Petition for Cathy Breen that was later filed and certified by our Secretary of State. (Attachment supplement)

On 1/31/14 -- just three-days later, Pam Fenrich signed *another* Primary Nomination Petition for Cathy Breen that was later filed and certified by our Secretary of State. (Attachment supplement)

On both Petitions, "Pamela Fenrich" is the very first signature that appears at the top on "Line 1." One element of the Nomination Petition process is that every potential signatory has the opportunity and benefit of seeing who is already supporting the candidate -- and using that knowledge as a material factor for voters and in the acquisition of all subsequent nomination signatures. As a well-known public figure in the political and community realm, Vice Chair "Pamela Fenrich" and her signature in #1 position on each form must be considered a factor for some or all subsequent voters that later signed below her. (It is another clear election violation to have the same person sign two (2) separate Nomination Petitions.)

On March 2, 2014, 2:45pm, I entered the Democratic Caucus at Falmouth Elementary School with one of my campaign coordinators (Dave Colson.) I approached Pam Fenrich (who was "running" this event -- as she does virtually all Democratic events in this area) and asked for the speaking order of the event. She informed me that towards the end of the program, SD#25, candidates would each have "5-minutes" to speak, with me going first and Cathy Breen going last. I reminded Pam that during the most recent Democratic event held (Cumberland County Dems -- 1/28 -- at Cumberland Town Hall) also organized by Pam -- that I went first then -- and a more fair sequence yesterday would be to alternate. Pam said, "No -- you're going first. You can leave if you don't like it."

I then suggested that we should at least "flip a coin" to determine the speaking order to be fair. Pam said, "No, I'm not changing the order, you're going first" following by just walking away from me in the middle of our discussion. (At that point -- Tim Shannon, a Yarmouth delegate, walked up -- and I asked him to engage in the discussion.) (It should also be noted that three other people witnessed this exchange -- and it was also videotaped.)

When Pam Fenrich returned, I reiterated my point to Pam that both "fairness" and reasonable election protocols supported my request for her to be impartial. Her response, (greatly impacted by the group of people now surrounding us) was "well, let me check with Cathy...."

My response – "Why in the world would you need to check with the other candidate in order to adopt something fair?????" I wasn't asking for any type of benefit or advantage – merely what was fair. A few minutes later, Pam returned with Cathy and all parties agreed to flip a coin to determine speaking order which was ultimately carried out. But, was it anything close to "fair" that it was necessary for me to publically fight with the Democratic Party Vice Chair in the middle of the Falmouth Elementary School cafeteria to achieve what was most reasonable to begin with? And, how was this episode exported to Cathy's supporters in the context of campaign currency?

Apparently, on May 28, 2014, the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" – again – led by Pam Fenrich – met and "voted" to publically endorse Cathy Breen. That vote – and the subsequent email blast (it was an "advertising" action) – is still suspect in regard to legal authority and ethics.

Here and in previous correspondence, I'm asking the Maine Ethics Commission to investigate the following;

- By what legal authority does the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" exist? (Charter, filings, etc.)
- Given that it appears that everyone at the May 28th meeting was directly associated with the Breen campaign, who in total attended this "meeting?"
- At what time of day on May 28th did this meeting start? End?
- Which members in name – actually "voted" to endorse Breen? Exactly who was at this meeting?
- Was candidate Breen in attendance to any part of this meeting where the "endorsement vote" occurred?
- Given that this meeting was presented as being an official function, where did the meeting take place?
- How was this meeting "noticed" to the public? If it wasn't "noticed" how would my supporters know to attend?
- Was a quorum reached in the vote – and where in the published charter are the quorum requirements?

-What other official "meetings" and votes have been taken by the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" over the last 12-months? Where are those "minutes" and how are those records kept and shared with members and the public?

-Why did Pam Fenrich "recuse" herself as indicated in the "minutes?" For what reason? And, if her reason was to fulfill a directive from the MDP, why then broadcast a destructive email about me – in support of Cathy Breen – just days before the election?

-Does the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" have any recorded revenue or expenditures from the last 12-months? Details?

-Where did the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" attain their email list as referenced below? (Please ask them for a copy of the list used.)

-Who with the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" has access to the contact list used? Did/does anyone associated with the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" have access now (or anytime in the past) to the MDP's "VAN" list of voters – in any part or manner?

-Where did Pam Fenrich receive or acquire her email list that was utilized? (Please ask for a copy of this list.)

I don't believe that the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" meets any reasonable standard for being a legitimate organization. And, it certainly didn't act independent to the Breen campaign – as it appears that everyone in attendance was associated with Breen directly.

- 6) Dishonest/Unethical Communication. Since the start of the Breen campaign, there is a clear and compelling pattern of dishonest and unethical acts that go beyond what has been reviewed herein. Given that some of these acts have been communicated to Senate President Alford and he has taken no action, this is a matter that warrants investigation by the Maine Ethics Commission. Whereas my campaign was focused on a review of my 35-year, career in business and civil service, coupled with my vision for Maine going forward – the Breen campaign message was almost exclusively based upon the collection, amplification, and many times, the complete fabrication – of "endorsements" filtered through Pam Fenrich and her support organization.

One of the more egregious examples, the highly touted and broadly exported, "Mayor Colleen Hilton of Westbrook endorsement – 'Cathy Breen understands that towns in the Greater Portland region need to work together (not compete against each other) to grow our economy and promote economic growth.'" The problem? Mayor Hilton never said or expressed those words – they were written by Cathy Breen herself. Also, Mayor Hilton had never met or even spoken with Cathy Breen. According to Mayor Hilton – who I've actually met – and spoken with – she was approached by someone (Bonny Rodden?) by phone and her "endorsement" was in fact, a misunderstanding.

And there are numerous other examples throughout the Breen "endorsement list" that are gross distortions.

- 7) Conspiracy by the MDP. On May 31, 2014, in Bangor, Maine, the Maine Democratic Party held its state convention – an event that I attended as an elected official (Chairman-Yarmouth Town Council), State Senate candidate, and as an official delegate. On that day, as part of the "official" activities of the MDP, each of the 16 counties gathered in separate break-out sessions. I attended the Cumberland County session, which was attended by approx. 100-150 people – all presumed to be residents/voters/delegates from Cumberland County. As an agenda item during that meeting, Cumberland County, Chairwoman, Rachel Hendrickson, went to great lengths to praise Pam Fenrich in regard to her "system" to help "good democrats" to get elected. Rachel went on to give some case study examples of how Pam Fenrich helps various candidates. Rachel then suggested that any candidate that wants to win an election that they take one of Pam Fenrich's "seminars."

The "conspiracy" standard is met in a number of areas. Most recently when I asked Ben Grant, Chairman of the Maine Democratic Party (email on June 9, 2014, 5:49pm) to provide assistance in regard to understanding the actions and validity of the "Falmouth Democratic Committee", he effectively refused to assist me with obtaining the requested information, instead he suggested I ask John Brautigam (Breen's Campaign Treasurer) for any details.

Back on January 21, 2014, 10:50pm, I received an email from Marc Malon (MDP- Senate Caucus Director) assuring me that the MDP would "...be neutral.." in regard to my primary race with Breen. Malon also wrote, "The Democratic voters of SD-25 should have the final say on who it shall be" referencing the primary race. The email also included a list of seven things that the MDP would and wouldn't do; #7: "We will not provide your (sp) or your opponent with strategic advice on how to win the primary." (Which is exactly what the MDP did, primarily through the actions of MDP Vice-Chair Pam Fenrich.)

In the course of an investigation by the Maine Ethics Commission, I intend to present additional evidence showing that the Breen campaign directly benefited in a significant and material manner from the coordinated actions by Pam Fenrich, the Cumberland County Democrats, the Falmouth Democratic Committee – and that those "actions" were predatory in nature and as such, were unconstitutional. A reality that one of Maine's highest elected officials, Senate President Justin Alford, had direct knowledge of, as he made the conscious and deliberative decision to not take reasonable action. In addition, those actions equated to thousands-of-dollars in value to the Breen campaign that was not reported.

- 8) Summary. It cannot be argued that Pam Fenrich was merely a "supporter" of Cathy Breen when in fact, she played a central and critical role in the entire campaign – and by direct association so did Senator Justin Alford, and the Maine Democratic Party.

And in no way can Fenrich claim innocence in regard to various claims and allegations being made based upon a lack of political understanding. (Further supported by her campaign "sessions" as described at the State Convention)

Also, for many, many years (decades?), Fenrich has played leadership roles in many organized democratic groups;

- Current vice -Chair of Maine Democratic Party
- Current Chair of Falmouth Democratic Committee
- Past Vice President – Cumberland County Democrats
- Past Chair of Dem Corps

It is not hyperbole to say that Pam Fenrich might be one of the most politically experienced and astute "operatives" here in Maine. I do not believe that individually anything suggested in this report happened by accident – and I certainly do not believe that it ALL happened by happenstance. The "Falmouth Democratic Committee" just happened to get together the week prior to the election to endorse Cathy Breen – a meeting led by Pam Fenrich – and attended by only Breen supporters and staff???

Fenrich, Breen, the Maine Democratic Party, and Senator Justin Alford all played deliberate and willful roles in the 2014 State Senate District #25 election. Based upon currently known facts and information in regard to Maine State Senate candidate, Cathy Breen, her campaign staff, Maine Democratic Party Chairman, Ben Grant, and various MDP staff, what happened during the 2014 SD#25 campaign period and during the election process in itself, went way, way beyond "politics" and clearly represented both unethical behavior and acts, along with what I believe will be proven as illegal acts too.







Ben,

I'm writing to you as our state Chairman of the Democratic Party with a formal complaint against Vice-Chair Pam Fenrich.

Since my very first interaction with Ms. Fenrich last year she has been insulting, disrespectful, and yesterday, blatantly unethical. Because details matter, let me start by recreating what happened yesterday – almost precisely verbatim. (Two folks witnessed this exchange in totality and Tim Shannon – Yarmouth Dem Chair – was witness to most of it.)

-At approx. 2:45pm yesterday I entered the Democratic Caucus room at Falmouth Elementary School with one of my campaign coordinators (Dave Colson.) I approached Pam Fenrich and asked for the speaking order of the event. She informed me that towards the end of the program, SD#25, candidates would each have "5-minutes" to speak, with me going first and Cathy Breen going last.

-I reminded Pam that during the most recent Democratic event held (Cumberland County Dems – 1/28 – at Cumberland Town Hall) also organized by Pam – that I went first then – and a more fair sequence yesterday would be to alternate. Pam said, "no – you're going first."

-I then suggested that we should at least "flip a coin" to determine the speaking order to be fair. Pam said, "no, I'm not changing the order, you're going first" following by just walking away from me in the middle of our discussion. (At that point – Tim Shannon walked up.)

-I reiterated my point to Pam that both "fairness" and reasonable election protocols supported my request for her to be impartial. Her response, "well, let me check with Cathy..."

-My response – "Why in the world would you need to check with the other candidate in order to adopt something fair?????" I wasn't asking for any type of benefit or advantage – merely what was fair.

-Pam walked away.

-A few minutes later, Pam returned with Cathy and all parties agreed to flip a coin to determine speaking order which was ultimately carried out. But, was it anything close to "fair" that it was necessary for me to publically fight with the Democratic Party Vice Chair in the middle of the Falmouth Elementary School cafeteria to achieve what was most reasonable to begin with? And, how was this episode exported to Cathy's supporters in the context of campaign currency?

-When Cathy Breen spoke to the Caucus, Pam broke protocol and allowed Cathy to speak for 7-minutes/52-seconds. Why?

MY ISSUE(S):

-Pam Fenrich is openly hostile with malice towards me and my campaign while at the same time actively assisting Cathy Breen and her campaign. While the above details support a set of facts, it's as much her attitude and palpable disrespect that is most concerning. Why would a party leader walk away from a State Senate Candidate in the middle of him (me) making a valid and important point? What possible rationale would exist for her needing to "check with Cathy?"

-On 1/28/14 -- Pam Fenrich signed a Primary Nomination Petition for Cathy Breen that was later filed and certified by our Secretary of State. (attached)

-On 1/31/14 -- just three-days later, Pam Fenrich signed *another* Primary Nomination Petition for Cathy Breen that was later filed and certified by our Secretary of State. (attached.)

-In regard to the duplicate Petition signatures, given that Cathy Breen was/is comfortably over the statutory number of signatures, Pam's extra signature might not have a material impact. But, shouldn't the "Vice Chair" of the State's Democratic Party know better? Three days apart?

-Pam allowing Cathy Breen to go way over the 5-minute speaking limit in itself is not a huge issue -- but it's relevant in regard to what is now a clear pattern.

Ben, as you and I discussed more than a month ago, I'm excited to run for State Senate representing District #25 as a proud and supportive Democrat. I'm thrilled to campaign in Cumberland, Gray, Yarmouth, portion of Westbrook, Chebeague Island and Long Island. But, Falmouth is something different. While it's a great town where I am proud to operate my business, it's a political environment that is often marked with divisive and contentious campaigning -- something that has already started. Now what was a challenging situation has become impossible with the State Democratic Vice Chair actively working against me.

Any pretense or suggestion that Pam Fenrich is impartial in her role as Vice Chair of the Democratic Party can no longer be supported by facts or reasonable judgment. If in a public setting, at the most visible Democratic event prior to the June 10th Primary, Pam Fenrich is openly hostile to me -- Isn't it reasonable to assume that what is being said/done behind the scenes is much more damaging?

Remedies:

- 1) I am requesting that Pam Fenrich, Vice Chair of the Democratic Party, immediately contact the Maine Elections Bureau and have both of her Petition signatures invalidated and removed from Cathy Breen's total. Since both forms were submitted simultaneously to the Elections Bureau, there is no practical way to determine which one was counted first.
- 2) I am requesting that the Democratic Party suggest to candidate Cathy Breen that she contact the Maine Elections Bureau and officially retract both Primary Nomination Petitions in question immediately. On both Petitions, "Pamela Fenrich" is the very first signature that appears at the top on "Line 1." One element of the Nomination Petition process is that every potential signatory has the opportunity and benefit of seeing who is already supporting the candidate -- and using that knowledge as a material factor for voters and in the acquisition of all subsequent nomination signatures. As a well-known public figure in the political and community realm, Vice Chair "Pamela Fenrich" and her signature in #1 position on each form may have been a factor for some or all subsequent voters that later signed below her.
- 3) I am requesting that the Maine Democratic Party Leadership immediately vote to suspend Pamela Fenrich from her role as "Vice-Chair" until after the June 10th Primary. Not to do so jeopardizes my campaign and any chance of impartiality in the upcoming election process. While nothing can un-ring the bell of Pam Fenrich's actions to date, for the Party to not take action now -- would cause further and potential permanent damage.
- 4) I am requesting an answer to this email and the suggested "Remedies" by Wednesday, March 5th, so that I can act accordingly.

Certain activities are prohibited on election day. [2003, c. 447, §22 (RPR).]

1. Instruction limited. Within the voting place, a person may not instruct another in the method of marking the ballot, except as provided in section 672.

[2003, c. 447, §22 (RPR) .]

2. Influence prohibited. On public property within 250 feet of the entrance to the voting place as well as within the voting place itself, a person may not:

A. Influence another person's decision regarding a candidate or question that is on the ballot for the election that day; or [2005, c. 568, §14 (AMD).]

B. Attempt to influence another person's decision regarding a candidate or question that is on the ballot for the election that day. [2005, c. 568, §14 (AMD).]

These limitations do not prohibit a candidate from attending the voting place and orally communicating with voters as long as the candidate does not attempt to influence their vote. A candidate may not state the name of the office sought or request a person's vote.

[2005, c. 568, §14 (AMD) .]

2-A. Application. This subsection governs the application of subsection 2.

A. Subsection 2 does not apply to pollwatchers, who may remain in the voting place outside the guardrail enclosure as long as they do not attempt to influence voters or interfere with their free passage. [2003, c. 447, §22 (NEW).]

B. Subsection 2 does not prohibit media representatives from conducting an exit poll, as long as they do not solicit voters until after the voters have voted and do not orally communicate with voters in a way that influences a voter's vote. [2003, c. 447, §22 (NEW).]

C. If a person attempts to influence voters or interfere with their free passage, the warden shall have that person removed from the voting place. [2003, c. 447, §22 (NEW).]

3. Advertising prohibited. A person may not display advertising material; operate an advertising medium, including a sound amplification device; or distribute campaign literature, posters, palm cards, buttons, badges or stickers containing a candidate's name or otherwise intending to influence the opinion of any voter regarding a candidate or question that is on the ballot for the election that day on any public property located within 250 feet of the entrance to either the voting place or the building in which the registrar's office is located. The term "sound amplification device" includes, but is not limited to, sound trucks, loudspeakers and blowhorns.

A. This subsection does not apply to advertising material on automobiles traveling to and from the voting place for the purposes of voting. It does not prohibit a person who is at the polls solely for the purpose of voting from wearing a campaign button when the longest dimension of the button does not exceed 3 inches. [2009, c. 253, §27 (AMD).]

B. Nonpolitical charitable activities and other nonpolitical advertising may be allowed at the discretion of the clerk if arrangements are made prior to election day. If arrangements are not made in advance of the election day, the warden may, at the warden's discretion, either allow or prohibit nonpolitical charitable activities and other nonpolitical advertising. [2003, c. 447, §22 (RPR).]

4. Devices for audible communication. Party workers or others may not use cellular phones, voice pagers or similar devices to make audible voice communication within the voting place that is in violation of subsection 2.

5. Violation. A person who knowingly engages in activities prohibited by this section commits a Class E crime.

[2003, c. 447, §22 (NEW) .]

6. Public property limited. For purposes of this section, "public property" does not include a public right-of-way across privately owned property if it is an easement right-of-way.

As just discussed by telephone, I am contesting and challenging the election results of June 10, 2014 and hereby request that you delay submitting the "Official Results" to the Governor's office until after my complaint is officially reviewed and resolved by your office, and if necessary, Maine's Attorney General's office.

Though I have a number of challenges in regard to how the Breen campaign (my opponent in the SD#25 democratic primary election) conducted itself, the central issue I am challenging today in specific to Maine Statute, Title 21-A, Section 681 – Chapter 9: Conduct of Elections and Subchapter 2: Election Procedure and Article 4: Restrictions.

First – the facts as supported by my own direct observations, observations by my campaign staff, observations by other candidates, and finally, as witnessed by Falmouth, Town Clerk & election Registrar, Ms. Ellen M. Planer.

-On election day, Tuesday, June 10, 2014, candidate Cathy Breen dispatched a number of family members, friends and supporters to various "Voting Places" to actively "advertise" her candidacy to voters as they were entering the various voting location in SD#25.

-What each of these surrogates said was along the lines of; "Hi..I'm Cathy Breen's husband...." Or "Hi...I'm Cathy Breen's daughter..." These interactions/conversations occurred throughout the entire election day -- sometimes with Breen present – sometimes not.

-In addition, Breen campaign staff/supporters, Bonny Rodden and Pam Fenrich, also spent time engaging voters as they were entering the various voting places.

The Issue. Maine law is very clear and detailed in this regard. The core principle of election law is to eliminate outside "influence" during the voting process and to allow all voters unfettered access to the voting place. In regard to allowed "Political Activities," the law is specific to "candidates" and candidates only in terms of what detailed voter engagement is allowed and legal.

"These limitations do not prohibit a candidate from attending the voting place and orally communicating with voters as long as the candidate does not attempt to influence their vote. A candidate may not state the name of the office sought or request a person's vote."

Nowhere in the statute are family members, friends of surrogates mentioned as having any rights to engage voters – as it is intentionally written for "candidates" only – with ALL others exempt from ANY role in the process. (For anyone to

suggest that the absence of language addressing non-candidates in relation to them affirmatively participating in voter engagement on election day -- would be absurd and illogical. Such an argument would then support & allow campaigns from enlisting or hiring hundreds of supporters to show up on election day to "engage" voters.)

Election law is deliberately prescriptive and rigid in regard to candidate messaging at the polling place (no campaign materials, no discussion of office being pursued, etc.) The principle for such vigilant election control is to insure that voters are not confronted with uncomfortable interactions or information within minutes & feet -- from actually voting.

In my case, election law precluded me from wearing a single, simple 2-inch lapel button that said "Steve Woods for State Senate" -- but Cathy Breen was allowed to have a living/breathing 5'8" campaign message in the form of Pam Fenrich standing right next to her as voters entered the polling place. Or, Breen was allowed to have thousands of interactions from her family member with voters?

It's well established that "symbols" are recognized as elements of communication. And the symbol of Pam Fenrich (a non-candidate for anything herself) standing next to Breen at the polling place was clearly a message to many voters, "Hi, I'm Pam Fenrich, Vice Chair of the Maine Democratic Party, Chair of the Falmouth Democratic Committee, well known as an iconic democratic activist in Falmouth and throughout Maine -- standing next to candidate Breen within inches of the doorway leading into the voting booths -- within days of having just sent out an email communication aggressively supporting Breen" -- is a clear and compelling message. (When a well-known professional athlete is viewed holding a Gatorade -- it's "advertising" even without any additional messaging, based simply on proximity. Same with Fenrich deliberately standing next to Breen.)

In fact, such "advertising" (Paragraph 3) is explicitly identified as a Class E "crime." (It is well established case law and brand marketing practice that merely mentioning "Cathy Breen" can and should be considered "advertising" under the statute -- even in the absence of a more detailed message, such as "Vote for Cathy Breen." Just the mention of "Cathy Breen" by anyone other than a candidate himself/herself is advertising by any standard -- and when it occurred a few minutes before voting -- and few feet from the voting booths -- it had a material and deliberate effect that was premeditated and intentional. (Just as a Coca-Cola sign is an effective "advertising" element in front of a store.)

It is my position that this is clear violation of Maine election law, which only (and appropriately) gives limited provisions for "candidates" themselves to greet voters. The absence of "family members" in the statute can only be viewed as an intentional element of the law. Otherwise, candidates with large families (20-30 members) would be at a distinct advantage over a candidate with a small family or, no family.

Also, why limit the scope to "family members" which is somewhat arbitrary -- when it can be argued that "friends" are just as important to many people as family. With that rationale, would I have been allowed to engage "200" of my "friends" to greet voters at voting places in SD#25 with the same message, "Hello, I'm a good friend of Steve Woods!" just as they were getting ready to vote, when name recognition and recall are critical? Clearly, not.

When I spoke with you earlier today, you (Julie Flynn) suggested that election law was somewhat vague on this issue and that your office was "interpreting" the law as to allow surrogates on election day. Can you please send me the written form of that "interpretation?" Also, what is the scope -- family members, friends, paid campaign staff? How is it monitored? How did Cathy Breen know that family members were allowed/legal and I -- and most candidates -- went by the letter of the law and believed that only "candidates" could be at the voting place to engage voters?

I've been an advertising/marketing executive for more than 30-years and I know first-hand that brand/name recall is critically important in all purchase/voting situations -- especially when they occur within minutes and feet from the decision.

In the case of the recent election here in State Senate #25, the Breen campaign had an unfair advantage as they were allowed to openly break election law in a manner that impacted the election results. Now, given that thousands of Breen

family interactions were all in violation of Maine election law -- and it can only be reasonably concluded that this violation was committed intentionally and in itself, this should call into question the results of the June 10th election.

The statute calls for the penalty (Class E crime) of up to six months of incarceration and \$1,000 fine per occurrence. I'm asking your office to impose that punishment (per interaction) after a thorough review. In the meantime, I am requesting that the result from the June 10, 2014 SD#25 election is NOT certified by the Governor until this matter is resolved.

(And if you are aware of any materials that fall under the scope of these requests, but cannot be located for any reason, please detail that information and any suggested explanation for why information might be unavailable.)

- 1) All requests below are for the time frame, November 1, 2013 through June 24, 2014
- 2) All correspondence, meeting notes, documents – shared in any form between yourself – (including anyone acting on your behalf or with your knowledge) - and Ben Grant, Chairman of the Maine Democratic Party (MDP,) in which the 2014 State Senate District #25 race is mentioned or referenced. This includes any/all references to me personally, and in addition, my (Steve Woods) candidacy/campaign or the candidacy/campaign of Cathy Breen.

In advance of our scheduled 3:00pm interview today, I've compiled a few questions and areas of discovery that I would like to suggest be explored in your investigation.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- By what legal authority does the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" (FDC) exist? (Charter, filings, etc.) Has Cathy Breen ever held an official role with the FDC?
- When was Pam Fenrich elected to serve as the current President of the FDC? (Details and "minutes" from that meeting requested.)
- Given that it appears that everyone at the May 28th meeting was directly associated with the Breen campaign, who in total attended this "meeting?" A complete listing of names and attendees is requested.
- Names of all "yes" and "no" voters at the May 28th meeting that voted to support endorsing Cathy Breen? The "one" abstention?"
- At what time of day on May 28th did this meeting start? End?
- It's be disclosed that the May 28th meeting took place at the "Falmouth Town Hall." By what method was permission granted by the town of Falmouth to utilize space at the Town Hall for the May 28th meeting? Please provide copies of all communications in this regard.
- Which members in name – actually "voted" to endorse Breen? Exactly who was at this meeting? Was Breen at the meeting?
- Was candidate Breen in attendance to any part of this meeting where the "endorsement vote" occurred?
- Given that this meeting was presented as being an official function, is it common for the FDC to meet at the Falmouth Town Hall?
- How was this meeting "noticed" to the public? If it wasn't "noticed" how would my supporters know to attend? Please provide evidence concerning the public notice given.
- Was a quorum reached in the vote – and where in the published charter are the quorum requirements?
- What other official "meetings" and votes have been taken by the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" over the last 12-months? Where are those "minutes" and how are those records kept and shared with members and the public?

-Why did Pam Fenrich "recuse" herself as indicated in the "minutes?" For what reason? And, if her reason was to fulfill a directive from the MDP, why then broadcast a destructive email about me – in support of Cathy Breen – just days before the election?

-Does the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" have any recorded revenue or expenditures from the last 12-months? Details?

-Where did the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" attain their email list as referenced below? (Please ask them for a copy of the list used.) (It's critically important to have the actual list used by the FDC in their mailing on May 28th to determine if it in fact is not part of the VAN.)

-Who with the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" has access to the contact list used? Did/does anyone associated with the "Falmouth Democratic Committee" have access now (or anytime in the past) to the MDP's "VAN" list of voters – in any part or manner?

-From January 1 – June 10th, 2014, did the Falmouth Democratic Committee distribute any other email messages (other than May 28th) or any other type (mailing, email, etc.) in regard to; Breen's campaign, my campaign, or any other aspect of the SD#25 race?

-Did anyone at the FDC ever receive and information from anyone at the Maine Democratic Party (MDP) in regard to SD#25 race?

-In the published minutes provided by the FDC (Falmouth Democratic Party) from their "May 28th" meeting, the FDC also "endorsed" candidate Kevin Joyce for Sheriff with a "unanimous" vote. Please provide any/all detail in regard to how the Kevin Joyce "endorsement" was conveyed to the members of the FDC. Another email blast? Written letters? Did Pam Fenrich send out a personal email? If not, why not?

PAM FENRICH INFORMATION

-Where did Pam Fenrich receive or acquire her email list that was utilized? (Please ask for a copy of this list.)

-Pam Fenrich claimed that she "recused" herself during the May 28th FDC endorsement vote. Why? Specifically, how could Fenrich purport to recognize a conflict in regard to an FDC vote – and then not recognize an even GREATER conflict in sending out an FDC endorsement in the form of a mass email?

-Pam Fenrich claims that her "personal" email was independently from the FDC. Was the copy (words) in the Fenrich email (June 5, 2014, 9:59am) original copy & words from Fenrich herself? If not, where did those words/copy come from – and authored by who?

-The subject line in the Fenrich email (June 5, 2014, 9:59am) is recorded as: Subject: FW: Falmouth Democrat Committee and Lots of Others Endorse Cathy Breen. The "Subject Line itself includes "FW" indicating that this email in question in fact did NOT originate with Fenrich and that she "forwarded" it from another source. From what source? When did it originate?

-Was the same or similar message – sent from Fenrich on June 5, 2014 – used in any other communications? (Fenrich claims it was her personal message.)

-From January 22, 2014, until June 10, 2014, what other emails, letters, or any other form of communications did Fenrich send out – or share with her “friends” – or any other party or parties – in regard to the Cathy Breen campaign, Steve Woods as a candidate, or any other aspect of SD#25 race?

-Needed: A complete list of the “30” personal email contacts suggested by Fenrich as being the sole recipients to her June 5th email.

-In the published minutes provided by the FDC (Falmouth Democratic Party) from their “May 28th” meeting, the FDC also “endorsed” candidate Kevin Joyce for Sheriff with a “unanimous” vote. Please provide any/all detail in regard to how the Kevin Joyce “endorsement” was conveyed your personal email group. Another email blast? Written letters? If not, why not?

GRACE MADDEN INFORMATION

-As the “Secretary” of the FDC, where did you get the copy/words/text utilized in the email sent on “5/29/2014, 12:45pm”? Who wrote the actual words included in the email? Did this email originate from Grace Madden herself? If not, by who? (The “Subject” line of this email contains two (s) “:” – suggesting that this email for forwarded to Grace Madden by someone else.)

-how did Grace Madden receive the email addresses used on May 29th?

-A review of the FDC email list utilized on May 29th is needed to cross-reference that list with the Fenrich list – and to also verify that it was derived from the VAN list.

-From January 22, 2014 – June 10, 2014, did Grace Madden send out any other emails or paper correspondence in regard to Cathy Breen Campaign, Steve Woods, or anything to do with SD#25? If so, please provide all details.

CATHY BREEN INFORMATION

-Did Cathy Breen herself – or have any direct involvement - with writing or producing in any way, any of the copy/text utilized by the Falmouth Democratic Party in the 5/29/14 email, the June 5, 2014, Fenrich email, or any other communications known, or not known, - that were conveyed or communicated by the FDC or Pam Fenrich in any manner? If so, what/when?

-Was Cathy Breen at the FDC meeting on May 28th?

-Is Cathy Breen aware of where all or any of the names and email addresses utilized in either the FDC email blast on May 29th or the Fenrich email blast on June 5th came from? Is Breen aware that any of the names/email addressed came from the MDP VAN file?

-Did Breen at any point give MDP VAN information in any form/manner to anyone at the FDC or Pam Fenrich – at any point?

Yesterday, the Maine Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices (the Commission) received the enclosed request for investigation from Steve Woods concerning his State Senate primary election opponent Cathy Breen and the activities of the Falmouth Town Democratic Committee in endorsing her. This memorandum is to provide preliminary notice of Mr. Woods' request and the procedures the Commission staff preliminary intends to use in handling the request.

Among other things, Mr. Woods argues that it was improper for the Falmouth Town Democratic Party to endorse Cathy Breen in the June 10, 2014 primary election and for Pam Fenrich, an officer of the Maine Democratic State Committee and Falmouth Town Democratic Committee, to distribute the endorsement by electronic mail. In the opinion of the Commission staff, these matters relate to the internal governance of political parties and are outside the jurisdiction of the Commission. Nevertheless, the request also asks the Commission to investigate whether there were campaign activities undertaken by the State and/or Falmouth Democratic Parties to promote Ms. Breen's nomination, issues within the Commission's jurisdiction as the State's campaign finance agency.

At this time, the Commission staff *preliminarily* intends to present Mr. Woods' request to the Commissioners at their next regularly scheduled meeting on Wednesday, June 25, 2014 at 9:00 a.m. (one week from tomorrow) The meeting will be held at the Commission's Office at 45 Memorial Circle in Augusta. At that meeting, Commission staff will seek direction from the Commissioners as to whether the staff should conduct any investigation. *These procedures are subject to change as the complaint was received yesterday, and the Commission staff is continuing to study the issues involved and to confer with the Commission's Counsel.*

June 17, 2014

By tomorrow morning, the Commission staff will request very limited information from some of the individuals involved concerning the email distribution of the Falmouth committee's endorsement and the leadership of Ms. Breen's campaign. The requests will be directed to Pam Fenrich and the Breen campaign. This information is requested for purposes of assisting the Commissioners in deciding whether to authorize any further investigation, as requested by Mr. Woods. Your prompt cooperation would be greatly appreciated. If the Commissioners decide on June 25 to direct the staff to conduct further investigation, the staff would pursue that after the Commission's meeting.

In setting these pre-meeting procedures, the Commission staff is guided by Chapter 1, Sections 4(2)(C) and 5(1) & (2) of the Commission's rules.

Mr. Woods may wish to attend the June 25 meeting to speak to the Commissioners in support of his request for an investigation. The Breen campaign and the party committees may wish to make comments as well, but at this time the Commission staff is not requesting any comments on June 25th.



On Monday, June 16, 2014, the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices received the attached complaint from Stephen M. Woods. Mr. Woods was a candidate for the Democratic nomination for Maine State Senate, District 25 covering Falmouth, Cumberland, Yarmouth, and nearby communities. He ran against Catherine Breen, who won the Democratic nomination in the June 10, 2014 primary election.

Complaint by Steve Woods

Mr. Woods contends that his campaign was disadvantaged by a series of actions by Pam Fenrich, a Democratic Party officer who resides in Falmouth, taken to assist Cathy Breen in winning the Democratic nomination. Ms. Fenrich is the Chair of the Falmouth Town Democratic Committee and the Vice-Chair of the State Committee of the Maine Democratic Party. Mr. Woods expected her to remain neutral between the two candidates and not to favor Ms. Breen.

The most recent action was an endorsement of Ms. Breen by the Falmouth Town Democratic Committee at a meeting on May 28, 2014 and the subsequent June 5th circulation of that endorsement by email to Falmouth Democrats. Mr. Woods believes that the email had a material impact on the outcome of the primary election. His frustration is heightened because in March 2014 he brought concerns about Ms. Fenrich to the attention of leaders in the Maine Democratic Party, including its Chair, and thought he had received assurances that Ms. Fenrich would "stay out" of the race. He suspects that the

endorsement was coordinated with or controlled by the Breen campaign, and asks the Commission to investigate the circumstances of the endorsement.

Although not detailed in the complaint, Mr. Woods complained to me by telephone of a pattern of preferential treatment by Ms. Fenrich toward Ms. Breen. According to Steve Woods, she circulated nominating petitions for Cathy Breen, favored her at one or two party caucuses, and – as a well-known Democratic activist in Falmouth – stood next to Ms. Breen when greeting voters at the polls. He also alleges that on the June 10 primary election, Ms. Breen’s treasurer and one other supporter were present within the voting area at a Falmouth polling place for an extended period of time.

Preliminary Gathering of Factual Information by Commission Staff

Because there is question whether Mr. Woods’ basic grievance is within the Commission’s jurisdiction, I have not asked for a full response from any of the respondents. We assume that they would disagree sharply with his characterization of the facts.

Rather, in the last few days, the Commission staff has requested preliminary information relating to one aspect of the May 28 endorsement. We examined whether there was evidence that Cathy Breen, her agents, or political committee suggested or cooperated with any expenditures of funds outside her campaign which would represent an in-kind contribution under 21-A M.R.S. § 1015(5). We have found no evidence of any coordinated expenditures that would constitute a contribution to Ms. Breen.

Jurisdiction of the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices

The Commission is an administrative agency within Maine State Government. Its duties and activities are determined by the Maine Election Law (Title 21-A, Chapters 13 and 14) and the Governmental Ethics Law (Title 1, Chapter 25).

Campaign finance. The primary function of the Commission is to regulate the financial activities of individuals and organizations engaged in the election process. We administer the following programs and requirements:

- Disclosure of contributions and expenditures (candidates, party committees, PACs and others are required to make financial reports to the Commission, which we make available to the public.)
- Contribution limits
- Maine Clean Election Act program
- Attribution and disclaimer requirements in campaign communications

Apart from these campaign finance responsibilities, the Commission receives reports of lobbyist activities, personal income statements of legislators and executive branch managers, and has a small role in offering advice and hearing complaints concerning legislative ethics.

Matters not in the Commission's jurisdiction. Members of the public sometimes contact our office concerning political or governmental conduct that they believe is unethical. We advise that our only "ethics" jurisdiction – in the sense of misconduct by public officials – extends to Legislators. This does not diminish the importance of some of the issues raised by the members of the public. They are simply outside the scope of issues that the Legislature has directed the Commission to regulate.

As a general matter, the staff recommends that the Commission avoid investigating alleged misconduct outside the Commission's jurisdiction, for few reasons. The Commission is a creature of the law that exists to carry out the responsibilities assigned by the Legislature. It is not a civic group or advocacy organization that can expand its mission of its own accord. Second, if the Commission issued investigative requests on matters outside the Commission's purview, the respondents could raise legitimate legal objections that might be upheld by the courts. Finally, speech about political candidates is strongly protected by the First Amendment. In general, the Commission should be cautious about investigating the circumstances of political speech unless it is implementing a mandate clearly set by the Legislature.

Exemption for Volunteer Activities and Voters Lists

The Legislature has exempted certain activities from campaign finance regulation. One such exemption is for volunteerism. (21-A M.R.S. § 1012(2)(B)(1)) Volunteerism can take many forms, but one common volunteer activity is designing or distributing communications urging support for a candidate. These activities can have tremendous value in building support for a candidate, but do not count toward disclosure requirements or contribution limits administered by the Commission. Another exemption is for lists of registered voters or voter identification information that a party committee has maintained for party building purposes and that are given by the party committee to a candidate who is a member of that party. (21-A M.R.S. § 1012(2)(B)(6))

Commission's Standards for Requests for Investigation

Under 21-A M.R.S.A. § 1003(2), a person may apply to the Commission to investigate whether an organization has violated campaign finance law. Under this provision, the Commission "shall review the application and shall make the investigation if the reasons stated for the request show sufficient grounds for believing that a violation may have occurred."

Recommendation from Commission Staff

This matter was quickly scheduled for your June 25 meeting in order to give Mr. Woods resolution on the question of whether the Commission was a forum that might provide him with any remedy. He has asked for an opportunity to address you in person at the June 25 meeting to urge you to conduct an investigation. In keeping with our customary role at your meetings, the staff comments that we are having trouble seeing a legal violation that is within the jurisdiction of the Commission. This should not be construed as a judgment that Mr. Woods' concerns are unfounded or unimportant. They relate to the internal governance of the Maine Democratic Party, which is outside the Commission's jurisdiction.

As noted above, we have found no evidence of any coordinated expenditures that would constitute a contribution to Ms. Breen. Thank you.
