The Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife (IF&W) in Cooperation with the Department's Landowner and Sportsmen Relations Advisory Board (LSRAB) are once again hosting a Landowner / Land User Awards Banquet.

Over 90% of Maine's land is privately owned. Outdoor enthusiasts rely on the generosity of private landowners to allow public access to their land. Additionally, the responsible and appropriate use of private land by various user groups has helped to build relationships between landowners and land user groups which allow many outdoors recreational opportunities to flourish. The IF&W Landowner Relations Program seeks to maintain Maine's unique heritage and ensure that the outdoor recreational opportunities available today, will continue to be available to future generations.

The Landowner Relations Awards Banquet is an annual event sponsored by IF&W and the LSRAB. Nomination forms are distributed to various user groups, (ATV clubs, snowmobile clubs, fish and game clubs) and landowners. The nominations are then reviewed by an awards committee from LSRAB. The selection committee seeks to recognize the most outstanding landowners and land user group through public recognition at our annual awards banquet.

Enclosed, please find the nomination form for Landowner of the Year Award. All nominations must be submitted by June 6, 2014.

Awards will fall under the following categories:

- Private landowner - 100 acres or less;
- Private landowner - 100 acres or more;
- Corporate landowner;
- Public landowner (i.e. Towns, municipalities); and
- Conservation landowner (i.e. state parks, land trusts)

Nominees can include any landowner who meets the above classification; previous award winners have been:
