Physical Characteristics

Area - 12 acres

Maximum depth - 8 feet

Temperatures: Surface - 69⁰F 7 feet - 67⁰F

Principal fisheries: Largemouth bass, yellow perch, chain pickerel

Mill Pond is a small shallow pond created when a dam was constructed on the stream by the landowner.

An intensive study was conducted on Mill Pond in the early 1960's to provide information on warmwater fish management. In conjunction with this study largemouth bass were introduced to the pond in 1967. Further investigations revealed that the bass were successfully spawning.

Access to Mill Pond is over privately owned land; therefore, landowner permission is necessary.
