

## TILTON POND Fayette Twp., Kennebec County U.S.G.S Fayette, Maine

Physical Characteristics

Area - 115 acres

Maximum depth - 44 feet

Principal fishery: Rainbow smelt, largemouth bass, chain pickerel

Tilton Pond has an oxygen deficiency in the deeper water, therefore management for coldwater sport fish is impractical.

Smelt eggs were transferred in the 1980's in hopes of establishing a population that could support a commercial harvest. The tributaries are closed to smelt dipping.

A carry in boat site is owned and maintained by the Department of Conservation. This site is located on the southeast shore off route 17.
