Adams Pond was chemically reclaimed in September, 1955 to remove competing species and permit intensive management for brook trout. Illegal introductions of largemouth bass, smallmouth bass and white perch have occurred, resulting in intensive competition for the brook trout. Anglers should be aware of the serious consequences that these illegally introduced species can have on trout management.


Due to the lack of spawning habitat, Adams Pond is stocked annually with brook trout. Yearling brook trout stocked on an annual basis are producing a satisfactory fishery. A few trout in the two pound range are taken every year.

Adams Pond is closed to fishing during the winter. Special regulations are in effect to distribute the catch and to prevent the introduction of other undesirable species.

Access near the outlet is limited to carry-in with small boats or canoes.
