Grindstone Pond is located a short distance north of Tufts Pond. A small inlet enters the pond on the northwest shore. Its outlet flows southeast into Tufts Pond. The shoreline is undeveloped.


Water quality in Grindstone Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. Brook trout are stocked annually to maintain a fishery due to limited spawning area. Trout growth is good despite competition from other fish species.

Grindstone Pond is accessible via a side road off the Tufts Pond Road. The pond is open to fishing with the use of live fish as bait being prohibited. The pond is closed to icefishing. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
