Physical Characteristics

Area - 260 acres	Temperatures

Principal Fishery: Yellow perch, pickerel	24 feet - 47°F.

Eagle Lake should be managed for its existing yellow perch and pickerel populations. The small area within the lake that is biologically suitable for cold-water fish is so heavily populated with pickerel that stocked salmon or trout would have little chance for survival.

On occasion trout that have moved into the lake during migration periods will probably be taken.


No stocking is recommended.
