Round Pond is the uppermost and smallest in a chain of three ponds comprising the Long Pond drainage on scenic Mount Desert Island. A fair (suitable for canoes/small boats only) public landing site exists slightly north of Route 102.


The pond has a small volume of cool water suitable for trout in the summer. Stocked spring yearling brook trout provide some immediate fishing and an acceptable winter fishery for 12 to 14-inch trout in most years. A two trout daily bag limit is in effect.

Most angled pickerel measure between 13-15 inches. Although bass are not plentiful, some fish attain attractive weights of 2 1/2-3 1/2 pounds.


