Howard Pond is located southwest of Mount Dimmock. Its main inlet, Meadow Brook, enters the west end of the pond from the north. Its outlet, Pond Stream, flows steeply south into the Androscoggin River. The pond's shoreline is heavily developed.

Water quality in Howard Pond is good for coldwater gamefish with cool, well-oxygenated water available at all depths throughout the summer months. Brook trout and salmon utilize limited spawning and nursery habitat in the pond's inlet. Both species are stocked to supplement the native populations and provide

fisheries. Growth is good with only light competition from other fish species.


Howard Pond is accessible from a small unimproved launch site near the outlet. The pond is open to fishing in the open water season with the use of live fish as bait being prohibited. It is closed to fishing in the winter months. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
