Rump Pond is located east of Rump Mountain. It has a small inlet entering at the northwest corner of the pond. A short outlet flows east into the Magalloway River.

Despite marginal water quality and heavy competition, Rump Pond's brook trout population exhibits good growth and survival. Habitat for natural reproduction is present in the inlet, the outlet, and along the shore lines.

Rump Pond is accessible via a gated private road.
