Mr. Speaker, in our conversations in our caucus in regards to this bill, there seemed to be a little bit of confusion in regards to the underlying purpose of the bill in regards to whether or not it was more driven towards issues regarding probate court and/or those issues regarding persons with intellectual disabilities. My understanding is, is that we believed it had more to do with probate issues and, therefore, we thought it would be more appropriate that it go to the Judiciary Committee. To the extent that either the author of the bill or someone with further knowledge on that could provide clarification, that'd be helpful.

The SPEAKER PRO TEM: The Representative from Newport, Representative Fredette, has posed a question through the Chair to anyone who may care to respond. The Chair recognizes the Representative from Westbrook, Representative Gattine.

Representative **GATTINE**: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, a response to the question from my friend from Newport, again the underlying issue in this bill is the functioning of a process within the Department of Health and Human Services impacting the rights of people with intellectual disabilities, processes and procedures that have been in place for many, many years. You know, I think it is clearly within the jurisdiction and the oversight of the Health and Human Services Committee, and I believe that's the appropriate committee for this matter to be decided.
