- Are Maine schools overlooking opportunities for locally sourced foods?
- Are there changes that the Maine Department of Education, the Maine Department of Health and Human Services and the Maine Department of Agriculture could make to increase the use of locally sourced foods in Maine schools?

- What are the biggest barriers to the participation of the students in your schools in school nutrition programs?
- What are your schools' biggest challenges in providing school nutrition services?
- What strategies have proven successful in encouraging student participation?

- Could your school use universal eligibility to maximize student participation by students eligible for free and reduced cost meals? What benefits and detriments do you see from universal eligibility?
- What are realistic goals to set for maximizing participation by students eligible for free and reduced cost meals? Are there challenges here that you have not mentioned so far?
- What are realistic goals to set for maximizing the use of available federal funding? Are there challenges here that you have not mentioned so far?
- What are the challenges and opportunities in using locally sourced foods in your school nutrition program?
- What could the Maine Department of Education and the Maine Department of Health and Human Services do differently to assist your schools in providing nutrition services to students?
- Are there opportunities or ideas on innovative approaches to improve programs overall?

Notes from July 7 meeting of Task Force to End Student Hunger in Maine

1. Present were: Sen. President Alfond, Rep. Kornfield, Sen. Millett, Rep. Reed, Rep. Black, Rep. Rankin, Rita Furlow, Michelle Lamm, Gail Lombardi for DOE, Therese Cahill-Low for DHHS, Ron Adams, Tiffany Krastis, John Woods, Clara Whitney for Kristen Miale, Holly Lusk. Absent were Sen. Langley and Tom Desjardin.

2. Senate President Alfond and Representative Kornfield welcomed task force members and introduced staff, Deirdre Schneider and Jane Orbeton from the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis.

3. Senate President Alfond announced the schedule for future meetings of the task force and invited feedback from members if they have problems with availability on scheduled days. All meetings will be held from 9:30am to 3:30pm, in the Cross Office Building in Augusta, except that the September meeting may be held in Bangor to enable the task force to visit a meals site and to hold a public hearing. The announced meeting dates (which are subject to change) are August 11, September 9, October 6 and December 8.

4. Gail Lombardi, representing the Department of Education, provided information to the task force on nutrition programs for students, including the school breakfast, school lunch, special milk, after school snack, and fresh fruit and vegetable programs. She provided information on the 8 full-time positions in DOE, one part-time position and one current vacancy. Task force members discussed the challenges to understanding childhood hunger posed by student meals data not including homeschooled students, foster children and other children who may be absent from school for some parts of the school year, and homeless students. With regard to the programs administered by DOE the task force heard the following information from task force members and a few members of the public:

School Breakfast Program

Maine has 680 schools offering school breakfast programs, serving breakfast for free, at reduced cost and at full cost. The Food Research and Action Center (FRAC) compiles data on the states and rates Maine as having the 17th highest participation in the country, with 52% of students eligible for free or reduced-cost breakfast eating school breakfasts according to materials distributed by the Maine Hunger Initiative. Barriers to higher participation include stigma, fitting time in for breakfast into the school day, schools not placing a high priority on breakfast, students not having time to eat after school begins, operational costs that exceed USDA reimbursement, and difficulty in getting completed application forms returned to school. What are the best practices for running school breakfast programs and ways to increase the use of local foods?

School Lunch Program

Maine served school lunches to 46.7% of students eligible for free and reduced cost lunches in 2014, as figured by DOE. This amounts to 11 million free lunches, 1.6 million reduced cost lunches and 7.6 million full price lunches. The Maine Hunger Initiative figures school lunch participation at 67%. Lunch prices range from \$1.50 to \$2.75. The new meal pattern

increases fruits and vegetables, whole grains and skim and low-fat milk. Elementary school programs have the highest participation rates while high school programs offer the most menu options. Barriers include stigma, difficulty in getting completed application forms returned to school, students preferring socializing rather than eating. More locally sourced fresher foods require more preparation and staff time. What are the best practices for running school lunch programs and ways to increase the use of local foods?

Summer Meals Program

This summer Maine has 337 summer meals programs, operated by schools, colleges, summer camps, municipalities and non-profits approved by the IRS as 501(c)(3) entities. Partnering among schools and local businesses and organizations is critical to success. Positive partnerships have been forged with fire, police and public safety departments, CAP agencies, the Girl Scouts, Healthy Maine Partnerships, housing authorities and developers, and SNAP educators. The Maine Hunger Initiative figures Maine's participation rate at 18%. Outreach could be through parents' networking, ambassador families, posting on 211.org and the national Y hunger hotline. Mini grants from the Good Shepherd Food Bank this year have been used successfully for a variety of purposes, including literacy and science programming and transportation. Barriers to more programs and higher participation include stigma, fear of costs exceeding revenues, schools feeling that summer meals are not their responsibility, and the challenge of transportation during summer vacation. What are the best practices for running summer meals programs and ways to increase the use of local foods?

5. Therese Cahill-Low, representing the Department of Health and Human Services, provided information to the task force on CACFP nutrition programs and the 4 full-time positions in DHHS that administer the programs, coordinate with the child care subsidy program and provide outreach and public relations and all other needed services. With regard to this program the task force heard the following information from task force members and a few members of the public:

CACFP (Child and Adult Care Feeding Program)

The USDA provides \$16 million per year in funding for nutrition programs at child care and adult care settings that operate on a year-round basis. Maine DHHS also administers 31 programs that operate during the school year only for at-risk youth through age 12, migrant youth through age 15, and disabled youth through age 18, and over 400 after school programs. The Maine Hunger Initiative figures Maine's participation rate in at-risk after school programs, which offer enrichment activities and serve snack and dinner, at .8%. The CACFP reimbursement rate is higher than other programs, reimbursing \$2.93 for lunch or dinner. The average cost of lunch or dinner is \$3.50 to \$3.75. Could participation by sites increase with more public relations efforts and how can Maine coordinate or ease the transition from school year to summertime programs? What are the best practices for running CACFP, DHHS after-school and at-risk programs and ways to increase the use of local foods?

6. Task force members discussed the community eligibility provision (CEP), a process established by USDA to qualify a school system for the highest USDA reimbursement rates for a 4-year period based on certification of income eligibility of the families of the school's students. Coordination is needed for school systems among the USDA qualification requirements and the requirements for Title I and essential programs and services.

10. Please provide information on schools and school districts that participate in universal breakfast. Please provide information on mechanisms that they are using that other schools and school districts could use successfully. *DOE*

Issues and questions for the Task Force to tackle going forward

- A. What amount of federal money is Maine passing up on an annual basis by not fully utilizing school and student nutrition programs? What strategies could Maine utilize to increase access for students to food through these programs?
- B. What can Maine do to address the challenge of transportation?
- C. How could Maine encourage more schools, municipalities, businesses, nonprofits and other community partners to work together on ending student hunger? How can private partnership be increased to assist with costs not covered by reimbursements, such as staffing, advertising, outreach, etc.?
- D. Is the goal of the task force feeding all children or just those eligible for free and reduced cost meals and snacks?
- E. In looking at the CACF program, is it best to look at the program as a whole, or simply focus on the at-risk afterschool program?
- F. How can Maine keep student participation rates in these programs steady as students move from elementary to middle and high schools?
- G. What can be done to remove the stigma from receiving free and reduced cost meals?
- H. What can be done to increase participation by students and schools and school districts? What can be done to encourage schools to adopt the elimination/reduction of student hunger as a school priority (in order to increase buy-in)?
- I. What are reasonable goals and benchmarks to measure success over a 5 year period? What format should be used for the data?
- J. Are applications/forms a challenge? Is there a better way or more streamlined approach to get families to sign up for these programs if they need them and to report income? How can schools and school districts more fully utilize community eligibility, universal breakfast, eligibility data from TANF, SNAP and other federal and state programs? Is there a way to address Title 1 and EPS issues as it relates to the community eligibility provision?



- Encouraging sponsors/sites to learn who their community partners are. Having regular communication with community partners can improve outreach efforts and raise awareness of afterschool programs among both parents and the targeted children.
- Advertise the program activities to draw the children in and then state that meals are served free of charge. For example:

Advertising the activity has much less of a stigma attached to it than advertising “meal assistance”. Research has been done with summer meal sites that more kids will drop in at free meal sites if the sign or advertisement states something along the lines of “*Come join us for game night. Supper is on us!*” versus using the word free in an advertisement like “*Free meals served here! Stay for games, homework help and more.*”

Encourage afterschool sites to advertise all of the activities that are available to the students and then note that the children/families will not be responsible for the cost of the meal.

Sites can more fully participate in child nutrition programs by contacting the state agencies and learning about the different options. At-Risk sites should consider participating in the SFSP since they cannot be reimbursed through CACFP once school is out for the summer. (Please see the At-Risk to SFSP Handout)

The CACFP staff is currently updating the Maine CACFP webpage which will become a great resource for facilities to access contact information for statewide CACFP home and center sponsors, as well as to look for additional nutrition and physical activity programs that can be utilized at their programs.

Hello Patti,

The Maine Department of Education and the DHHS/CACFP have seen a greater interest in Summer Food Service Programs and At Risk programs. Staff from each agency has presented our programs to several entities in the State and developed a chart with contact information to aid those interested in understanding which agency to contact that fits the needs of their program.

The DOE compiles and sends the School eligibility information and we both are able to help agencies determine eligibility.

We started a shared list of the programs we sponsor to aid each agency in being able to contact institutions and encourage participation. We always provide information to new contractors as to who to contact regarding participation in both programs to avoid a break in services. We have talked about ideas that might work but haven't come up with a simplified plan as yet.

While we really want to work on streamlining participation for those already on one of the programs, the barriers are:

We are separate entities with different agreements and requirements; one using an on line agreement and claim process while the other uses paper claims and Access computer systems.

Work commitments of an already small staff have not allowed time to meet to explore the commonalities of the agreements and work on a prototype agreement.

One of the concerns of the CACFP State Agency is how to streamline a management plan for agencies that are multi-sponsors of unaffiliated centers as well as independent centers and still maintain the integrity of the agreement. We would prefer to collect all information we currently require to assure agreements meet USDA requisites until a plan is in place.

To better help our clients, we would be very appreciative of any resources or ideas you may have from other states that would help us balance the needs of DOE and CACFP as well as serve new and existing clients.

About the Programs

The *Summer Food Service Program* serves free, nutritious meals and snacks to kids and teens in low-income areas during the summer. The meals help children get the nutrition they need to grow, learn, and play when school is out.

The *CACFP At-Risk Afterschool Program* provides eligible after school programs with funds for nutritious meals and snacks served to all children and teens 18 years and younger. Providers can receive reimbursement throughout the school year for each child who is served a snack and/or meal after school hours.

These programs complement one another nicely.

CACFP At-Risk ends with the school year just in time for summer to begin. The After-School Snack Program through the National School Lunch Program is another option for programs, but it does not allow for non-school programs to participate or for a supper meal to be reimbursed. This full meal is a key offering with the At-Risk program.

Why these Programs are Important:

Hungry children cannot learn.

Many children rely on the meals and snacks they receive at school. Healthy food is not always available for these children when the school day ends and when school lets out for the summer months. By providing nutritious food after school and during the summer children will have the fuel they need for success, as well as a safe place to learn and play.

Who is Eligible?

SFSP

There are a variety of ways to qualify a Summer Meal site.

- School data
 - 50% or more of the children are eligible for free or reduced price school meals
- Census data
- Local data

CACFP At-Risk

After school programs may receive CACFP meal and snack reimbursement if:

- Educational or enrichment activities are provided
- Programs are located where 50% or more of the students qualify for free or reduced price school meals
