Make the following changes to the Bid Documents:

In the Bid Book (pages 48 and 49), **REMOVE** "SPECIAL PROVISIONS, SECTION 104, Utilities" 2 pages dated December 20, 2010 and **REPLACE** with the attached "SPECIAL PROVISIONS, SECTION 104, Utilities" 5 pages dated January 18, 2011.

In the Bid Book (page59), **DELETE** in its entirety "SPECIAL PROVISIONS, SECTION 107, TIME, Incentives/Disincentives"

The following questions have been received:

Question: Special Provision, Section 104 is incorrect as it references the Saco project. Please clarify.

Response: Please see the above change.

Question: SP Section 107, Incentive/Disincentive references back to SP Section 104. I cannot find this?

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Response: There are no Incentives/Disincentives associated with this project. Please see the above change.

Question: The MDOT owns the right-of-way, so is it possible to eliminate paragraph 9 (c) of the railroad indemnification (page 229 of the Bid Book)?

Response: Maine DOT does not own all of the Right of Way in conjunction with this project, so Paragraph 9(c) of the Railroad Indemnification will NOT be eliminated.

RAILROAD INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Railroad Protective Insurance

- 1. The Contractor shall furnish, with respect to the operations of the Contractor or any of the Contractor's subcontractors performing within the Railroad right-of-way, broad form Railroad Protective Liability Insurance covering all work performed under this Contract in the amount of not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence, \$6,000,000 aggregate combined bodily injury and property damage.
- 2. The insurance hereinbefore shall be written on an occurrence basis.
- 3. The Department and applicable railroads shall be named insured on the insurance herein- before.
- 4. The Contractor shall furnish to the Department and railroad companies a signed original of the policy for Railroad Protective Liability prior to entry upon the railroad right-of-way.
- 5. All certificates shall be endorsed to provide 30 days notice to each named insured by the insurance company before any change or cancellation of the policies.

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- 6. The required Railroad Protective Insurance provided herein must be in the form commonly referred to as the AAR-AASHTO- Form (not Oregon).
- 7. Original policies and certificates shall be made out to the Department and applicable railroads and mailed to:

RAILROAD GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The contractor will be required to enter into a Railroad Service Agreement with Pan Am Railways for doing work at the Freeport location. A sample copy of this agreement can be found in the appendices. The contractor will also be required to have a railroad flagger on site with them every day that they perform work in Freeport and Brunswick. The cost of a flagger for the day in Freeport is \$550 and will be paid by the contractor directly to the railroad and said costs will be incidental to the contractors bid. The cost for a flagger in the Brunswick area is \$500 and will be paid by the contractors will be incidental to the contractors bid.

SPECIAL NOTES TO CONTRACTOR

The intent of this MDOT Special Provisions, Section 104 Specification is to specify the utility coordination issues that are to be executed during the construction process by the Contractor. The Department has established utility accounts with the utilities involved as well as communicated to the utilities the intent of the project and Contractor's scope of work. As a result, there should be a mutual understanding of what is required of both the Contractor and the involved utilities.

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The intent of this Specification is not to define the complete scope of the Contractor regarding the entire project. The complete Contractor's scope of work is defined in the specification developed by McFarland Johnson, titled <u>"Passenger Rail Upgrade - Platforms, Brunswick and Freeport, Maine</u>", dated January, 2011 and related drawings. However, it is reiterated in this specification that as part of the Contractors scope of work, the Contractor shall work with and follow the rules established by the operating railroads for each segment of work.

Utilities need ample time to respond. It is the Contractors responsibility to provide adequate notification regarding coordination and inspections of utility related facilities as required.

All utility related work shall comply with the most recent version of any Code that governs the installation of infrastructure, as applicable.

UNDERGROUND

The Contractor is being made aware that there are underground facilities associated with the developments at both locations and that these locations should be carefully identified and marked. While it is not the intent to impact or re-locate these utilities for they should be located outside of the railroad right of way, but they will be very close to it. Every effort should be made not to disturb the utilities and should there be a need to do so, then the contractor will work with the effected utility and provide sufficient notice to the utility that support is required.

UNDERGROUND UTILTIY FACILITY LOCATIONS

<u>Unless otherwise specified, any underground utility facilities shown on the project plans represent</u> <u>approximate locations gathered from available information.</u> The Department cannot certify the level of accuracy of this data. Underground facilities indicated on the drawings have been collected from historical records and/or on-site designations provided by the respective utility companies. Underground facilities indicated on the cross-sections have been carried over from the plan view data and may also include further approximations of the elevations (depths) based upon straight-line interpolation from the nearest manholes, gate valves, or test pits.

DIG SAFE

The Contractor is responsible for determining the presence of underground utility facilities prior to any excavation work and shall notify the area utilities in accordance with State of Maine Title 23, MRSA 3360-A. Call 1-888-344-7233.

BLASTING
