This Private Equipment Rental Agreement (hereinafter referred to as "**Contract**") is entered into by and between the **MAINE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION** (hereinafter referred to as "**MaineDOT**" or "**Department**"), an agency of state government with its principal administrative offices located at Child Street, Augusta, Maine, and _____, a corporation or other legal entity (hereinafter referred to as "**Contractor**"). The following attachments are hereby incorporated into this Contract by reference:

MaineDOT and the Contractor, hereby agree that the Contractor shall provide the equipment described in Appendix A and a licensed experienced operator to perform construction and maintenance services (hereinafter referred to as "**Contract Work**") as requested and directed by MaineDOT and in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth below. This Contract is not a guarantee of work; Contractor shall be hired on an as needed basis during the term of this Contract.

1. **Work & Term.** The Contractor agrees to provide the equipment listed in Appendix A for use on

2. **Equipment.** Contractor shall be responsible for all fuel, grease, oil, maintenance, servicing, operation, protection required for their equipment, in addition to mobilization and all other incidentals. Contractor shall provide for the required vehicle insurance, registration and licensing of any equipment used to perform the services herein.

4. **Standard of Care and Correction of Errors.** Contractor hereby represents and warrants that the Contractor and its employees have the requisite skills, and expertise to perform all Contract Work using the accepted standards of care in the Contractor's profession or occupation. If MaineDOT finds either the equipment or the operator to be unsatisfactory, the Contractor shall provide an immediate replacement so as to avoid any impact on the project schedule. If Contractor is unable to provide a replacement in a timely manner, MaineDOT reserves the right to hire a new Contractor to complete the work.

5. **Insurance Requirements.**

Contractor Procured Insurance. Signed, valid, and enforceable Certificates of Insurance shall be provided to the MaineDOT upon execution of the Contract and whenever said policies are renewed thereafter during the period of the Contract. All insurance coverage must be provided by an insurance company or companies licensed or approved to do business in the State of Maine by the Maine Bureau of Insurance. Contractor shall pay all premiums and take all other actions necessary to keep required insurances in effect during such times as Contract obligations exist. Any requests for waivers, to the requirements below, shall be submitted to the MaineDOT.

Commercial General Liability Insurance. The Contractor and Sub-contractor(s) shall purchase and maintain a policy of Commercial General Liability or other coverage affording equal or greater protection as determined by the MaineDOT, in an amount not less than \$400,000 per occurrence and not less than \$2,000,000 in the aggregate. Such policy shall include products and completed operations as well as contractual liability coverage and must name MaineDOT as an additional insured.

Automobile Liability Insurance. The Contractor and Sub-contractor(s) shall carry Automobile Liability insurance covering the operation of all motor vehicles including any which are rented, leased, borrowed or otherwise used in connection with the project. The limit of liability under this section shall be no less than \$400,000 per occurrence and shall name MaineDOT as an additional insured.

Workers' Compensation Insurance. Contractor shall carry Workers' Compensation Insurance or shall qualify as a self-insurer in accordance with the requirements of the laws of the State of Maine.

6. **Rates.** Rates for equipment will be paid at the unit prices bid and attached in Appendix A in accordance with the process in Section 7. "Assignments". Mobilization to and from the jobsite will not be paid separately and will be considered incidental to the base rental rate.
7. **Assignments.** Contract Work will be assigned under these agreements according to the following process: The Contractors with the responsive bids that result in the three lowest rates with the Equipment and Operator with the appropriate attachments and capabilities (the "Assignment") will have the first option to enter into contracts. Up to three responsive responsible contractors meeting contract requirements will be awarded contracts. The Contractor, awarded a contract, with the lowest rate will be guaranteed payment for 100 hours of equipment rental with operator. The Department will notify the contractor prior to each storm whether or not services are expected to be required. If this Contractor is unable to accept the Assignment at the time the contractor is notified, then the Department may contact the contractor that submitted the next lowest comparative basis rate to see if that Contractor will accept the Assignment and subsequent Contractors in ascending order of the amount of their bids, until a Contractor accepts the "Assignment".
8. **Performance, Termination and Failure to Perform.** The MaineDOT reserves the right, prior to award, to inspect the equipment and reject because of condition, and the Contractor will have

the option to replace the equipment with another acceptable, equivalent unit or the MaineDOT will award the Work to another Contractor.

Operators shall have be familiar with the work being performed and have sufficient skill and experience to perform the Contract Work properly. Operators determined by the MaineDOT to be below normal acceptable standards of production or workmanship will be replaced with another acceptable operator immediately or the MaineDOT will assign the Work to another Contractor. Any person employed by the Contractor, who, in the opinion of the MaineDOT, is intemperate or disorderly or jeopardizes safety of any person or the Project shall be removed immediately by the Contractor. The employee shall not be employed again in any portion of the Contract Work without prior approval from the MaineDOT.

In the case of repetitive breakdowns during operation or if a piece of equipment is unable to run, is unsafe to operate or should not be run as determined by the MaineDOT, the MaineDOT will have the option to allow the Contractor to repair the equipment or replace the equipment with another acceptable unit, the MaineDOT may determine that the equipment is unsatisfactory and may assign work to another contractor or take other action that in the best interest of the state.

If a Contractor fails to work when required, furnishes unsatisfactory equipment or operators, refuses work assignments or performs it in an unsatisfactory manner, or fails to meet other contractual requirements, the Department may issue a written warning. If the Contractor subsequently fails to work when required, furnishes unsatisfactory equipment or operators, refuses work assignments or performs it in an unsatisfactory manner, or fails to meet other contractual requirements, the Department reserves the right to immediately terminate the Contract by written Notice of Termination. - Each plow truck must have a gross vehicle weight rating or registered weight of 50,000 pounds or greater.
- In accordance with law, each plow truck shall meet all state registration and inspection laws, and only be operated by persons having a valid CDL license.
- The plow truck shall be outfitted with a front plow having a length of no less than 10 feet.
- The plow truck shall be outfitted with a wing plow
- The plow truck shall have the ability to carry at least 10 cubic yards of material and be able to apply the material at prescribed rates, specified by MaineDOT such as those shown in Attachment B. Electronically controlled spreaders are preferred but not mandatory.
- The material spreader shall be properly calibrated to ensure accurate application and accounting of materials.
- The plow truck must have at least one high intensity rotating with a minimum rating of 1,000,000 candle power, or approved strobe equivalent, and shall be visible from all sides of the truck.
- The Department reserves the right to consider alternates and determine equivalency. All equipment is subject to the Department's approval prior to award of the contract.
- Work shall be performed under direct supervision of the MaineDOT crew supervisor or designee who will provide application rates and timing.
- After every event, the Contractor shall provide (electronic output as possible) the amount of materials used.

Measurement and Payment: Equipment rental with operator will be measured by the hour to the nearest ¼ hour. Time spent moving to and from the specified base before and after a given assignment or spent servicing and maintaining the equipment will not be measured for payment. Equipment rental will be measured for payment beginning no earlier than the show up time directed by the Maine DOT and end when equipment rental contract work is done for the day. The accepted quantities of equipment hours will be paid for at the contract unit price per hour, with no additional payment for overtime. MaineDOT will provide the necessary salt, liquid chlorides, and winter sand to be used as directed. Materials remaining at the end of each shift remain the property of MaineDOT and shall be returned to the point of origin, unless otherwise directed by the MaineDOT supervisor.

Schedule The Contractor shall provide and operate the equipment intermittently, as needed by the MaineDOT. The MaineDOT will provide as much notice as possible prior to scheduled contract work. The Contractor will be utilized when needed.

The Contractor shall respond and provide and operate the equipment when notified by the MaineDOT. The Contractor shall have supervisory personnel available by cell phone(s) prior to and throughout any winter storm. The phone number(s) shall be provided to the MaineDOT and updated as necessary. The Contractor's equipment shall also be equipped with communication devices that will allow the Contractor to promptly get a message to personnel. The Contractor shall have the truck and operator located within a reasonable distance from the plow route.

Bidding As a minimum, the Bidder will submit a bid Package consisting of the completed Appendix A or a separate attachment listing equipment description, capacity and rates, 2 copies of the completed and signed Private Equipment Rental – With an Operator form and any Certifications or Bid Requirements listed in the Bid Book.

Award and Contracting After Bid Opening and as a condition for Award of a Contract, the Department may require an Apparent Successful Bidder to demonstrate to the Department's satisfaction that the Bidder is responsible and qualified to perform the Work and that the equipment is acceptable to the MaineDOT.

The properly completed and signed Private Equipment Rental – With an Operator form provided with the Bid constitutes the Bidder's offer. Once the department has received any other pre-award items required, the Department will sign the Private Equipment Rental – With an Operator form and execute the Contract.

MaineDOT Salt Application Quick-Reference Chart (2010)

Pavement Temp. Range	Application Rate (#/LM)	Pre-wet Material	Comments
Above 32°	0 to 100	Salt Brine or Blend	A little salt goes a long way when temperatures are near freezing
25° to 32°	100 to 200	Salt Brine or Blend	Salt is very effective here. Pre-wetting with a blend will allow lower application rates.
20° to 25°	200 to 300	Salt Brine, Ice-B-Gone, or Blend	Salt effectiveness is dropping off in this range. A Blend or straight IBG will help.
15° to 20°	300 to 400	Ice-B-Gone or Blend	Pre-wetting is especially important. Your liquids will provide the extra boost needed.
15° or Below	Snow is usually dry and blowing in this range. If no ice or pack exists, plow only. DO NOT APPLY		If necessary, Spot treat icy patches with abrasives. If glazing occurs on high-volume, high-speed, P1 corridors, sand will not last and higher salt applications, with Ice-B-Gone pre-wetting, will be necessary.

General Notes:

- (1) Application rates should be on the lower end when temperatures are on the higher side of the range or remaining steady. Falling temperatures, and temperatures on the lower side of the range, will require applications on the higher side, and possibly in the next range if dropping rapidly.
- (2) High-volume, Priority 1 corridors will often require an additional 50#/LM
- (3) In any of the ranges, if the snow is dry and blowing off of the roadway, avoid application.
- (4) Pre-wetting under wet storm conditions is not required. In cases where the only pre-wetting liquid available is a high-performance chemical (i.e. Ice-B-Gone), it is better to save those products for the drier and colder conditions.
