JOB DESCRIPTION: This is a Night Crew position involving general highway maintenance and construction work involving the safe and efficient operation of various types of trucks and other motor vehicles used in the routine preparation of ground surfaces and roads to support a maintenance or construction project or program. Work may include serving as a lead worker. Work is performed under general supervision. **Scheduled hours for this position will be from Sunday 11:00 p.m. to Friday 7:30 a.m., eight hours, five nights a week.**
